Finally, the last of THE GAMESLETTERs (in its current form, i.e.)! Verry, verry solly to have been so slow in getting it out, but the last couple of months have been rather hectic, to say the least ... and we're way behind on everything once again. But there's finally a bit of light showing at the end of the tunnel, as things seem to have finally sorted themselves out.... ## First, a couple of words about #A4: The Wargaming section is longer than it should be, in proportion to the rest of the issue, because we had many more wargaming 'zines on hand to review. We really had to skimp on the Chess section. The Puzzle Patch, along with answers to problems in TGL's 81/82 & 83 will, as noted in #83, reappear in TG#7--as will reviews of most of the 'zines that didn't fit into this issue, plus lots of other material. We started off the DIPLOMANIA section with issue #36 of a 'zine, after stating we were only going to cover mags with less than 16 issue this time around, because it was the first issue of this 'zine which we've reserved. ## Now, on to important things.... Contrary to what we said in TGL #83, TGL will not continue in its present form. It will continue -- but as a newsletter of 2-4 pp., pubbed every 2-4 weeks, as material on hand dictates. Everything will go into TG except the newstype material: con info, books announced, new game announcements, tourney results, CoA's, events of importance, etc. We may list books, games & mags rec'd, space permitting, but they will be reviewed in TG. The new TGL will be 20¢ ea., 6/\$1 or multiples thereof. ## THE GAMESMAN will come out every 6-8 weeks, will average around 30-40 pages/issue (maybe there'll be an occasional double issue--very occasional, if at all), will be 75¢ ea., with subs in increments of 75¢ (say, 4/\$3) until we see the new postage rates next year. ## All current TGL subs will be transferred to TG, with all issues of TGL outstanding beyond #84, at the rate of 20¢ ea., into however many issues of TG are appropriate. (Those who don't want their subs converted will receive refunds, if they so request; those we don't hear from will automatically have their subs converted as of 15 Dec. 175.) The new TG will have covers (cover art is urgently needed, both front and back-b on w,  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11", suitable for offset reproduction), will be mailed in envelopes, and will consist of reviews, letters, columns, articles, complete games, etc. (all of which will be needed from you all, in great profusion, if TG is to succeed in coming out both frequently and regularly). Your current status (after this issue) is as follows: last issue on TGL sub \_\_\_; \$ deposit on hand \_\_\_\_; we still owe you TG#7 from way back \_ we do not hear from you to the contrary, your post-#8h status will be: last issue on TG sub \_\_\_; debit/credit remaining  $\underline{t}$  (ask for refund or apply something to it to extend TG sub and/or take out TGL sub). ## Note that most current TGL traders will get TG in trade, as noted above; however, some of you will also get TGL (\_\_\_), and a few of you will get TGL instead of TG (\_\_\_). ## Subs for the new TGL will be kept separate from TG; ads and flyers will continue to go out with TGL instead of TG, as TG will probably be mailed book rate. Ad rates for new TGL: \$1/printed side for flyers; 2¢/35-character line for classified ads (free up to 10 lines/issue for traders & subbers). ## TJS and TSJ combined into TSJ (same schedule & sub rates as TG); new SF newszine, SF&F NEWSLETTER, same rate and schedule as TGL: WSFN and SFN combined; TMN expanded, same schedule and sub-rate as TG and TSJ. 


