For a while it looked like the DIPLOMAT might become so rare as Costaguana in January, but somehow, here we are again. Having been in business for a little over one year, we were a bit surprised that, in a recent listing of those Diplomacy mags in existence, THE DIPLOMAT was listed as one of the "old" mags. This has caused some thought at this end of our typewriter. It has occurred to us that there may be some people out there who might wish to start their own mags. This issue is designed to encourage/caution those people. One other thought is important at this point: The chances are that Postal Diplomacy was invented more than the three times known to us. It may be that some Postal Diplomacy mags were born, spent their lives, and went out of print without ever getting the contact with the mainstream of Postal Diplomacy. This contact is vital as we see it, to help a potentially good mag develop and grow. If it had not been for contact with Conrad von Hstake at a crucial time in our history, THE DIPLOMAT might have already gone down the tubes. Fortunately, we did not go down the tubes, but we are alive and well, and living in Paoli. At any rate, one of the changes in the written rules that we would like to see would be the address of some of the officers of the IDF. Diplomacy mags are fun, and we would hate to see any perish because of lack of contact with the mainstream. Now to those of you who wish to start a mag of your own, we offer three pieces of advise as to what you will need. First of all, you will need plenty of spare time (like a teacher or military man) and plenty of money (also like a teacher or military man.) Every Dippy mag I know of except maybe Big Brother operates at a loss. You must accept this before you start, because it is a fact. Secondly, you must have something that sets you apart from the mob. Thus Granstark is anti-establishment, Erehwon is anti-Boardman, Costaguana is mad, Xenogogic has tons of Peer-oration (or perhaps that's Peer-rhosa), and International Enquirer was the munchedly funnies. Oh yes, THE DIPLOMAT has Just's Rule. Finally, you must be willing to conform to the spirit of the rules, (whatever that is!) You must be ready to dump any rule that is thought to be unhealthy from the point of view of other Gameemasters. We learned this the hard way. Unfortunately, now that we are acceptable, we will probably object to any unusual rules just like we were objected to early in our career. If you are still in the position to want to publish your own mag then we will be glad to offer our assistance in any way you want. Oh yes, and we will trade you for THE DIPLOMAT. PRESSING RELEASES

ROME(27 November 2653AUC) C. Villius Carinus, First Consul of Rome, was declared dictator today by the Roman Senate. The action took place as a result of reports from Livius Salinator, Ambassador Plenipotentiary to the mountain tribes under Conrad the Barbarous, that these tribes are preparing for an invasion of Italy. In the light of the circumstances, Marcus Manilius proposed that Carinus be made Dictator for the duration of the emergency instead of the usual six months. After some debate the motion carried 183-117.

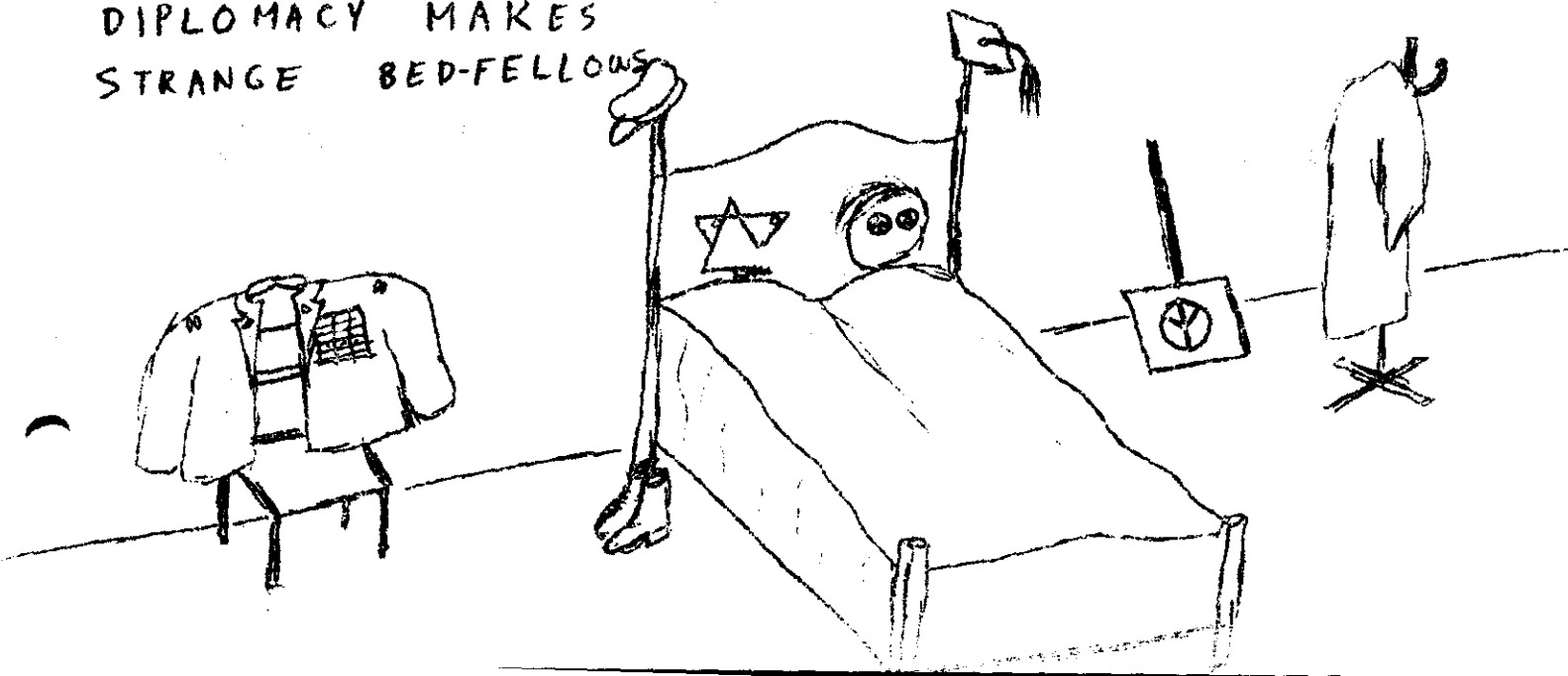
ROME(5 Ianuarius 2654 AUC) Reports from Vindobona indicate that Livius Salinator has been imprisoned by Conrad the Ignoble.

The day of the week, if the year is 1873, is Thursday, if 1877 Tuesday."

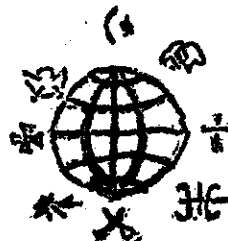

1967BD was an institution in itself. Since it was the only postal game that was known to us, we put a

great deal into the playing of it. In fact, I put more into that one game, than I put in on all the games I am in now. All the others put in a great deal of time and this was while Bruce Cecil (Italy) was going through Basic Training, and Joe Hawkins was teaching artillery at Ft. Sill. These pressures caused the two of them to resign their positions, but Joe, who was playing France, replaced himself with Bob Foster after the Spring move of 1903.

At first, THE DIPLOMAT was nothing but a form letter, and the game was nothing but the moves themselves. But two changes worked themselves into the game. With the third proclamation from Paoli, the letters became THE DIPLOMAT, and the players started putting a great deal of style into their letters. Joe started it. After the first move, all Official mail from the Republic of France bore the seal reproduced below. This led to a rash of such stuff as onion-skinned paper, etc. One other change appeared after the Spring 1902 move. On April Fool's Day, Jeff published the first issue of THE VOICE OF VIENNA, so that players could write press releases. This was still a month before any of us even knew about the rest of the postal Diplomacy world. THE DIPLOMAT has grown a little since then; THE VOICE sans Vienna has grown a lot, but the first few years of 1967BD will always be what I remember best. Now that I'm so busy with so many other things, and do not have as much time for any one, I look back and wish that life was still as simple as it was during the first moves of BD.

Reproduced below are four of the designs that we included in our letters. On the left is Jeff's double-eagle, which he designed himself after the real one. Next is the seal of the Republic of France, designed by Joe. Third is the official sign of the Co-ordinator (or Gamesmaster), which I used once or twice for letters of a nature that I did not want them confused with Russia's. Finally, we have the Russian double-eagles. I am not so original as Jeff, so I copied mine from the flag of the house of Romanov. The red stripe is supposed to be orange, but there are no orange carbons. Jeff may have a victory statement in I30. (He may not.)

Any rumors you have been hearing about the involvement of the International Swiss Conspiracy are all lies."

The Crown Prinz has been authorized to pass on the Air Captains' statements on forthcoming Italian foreign policy: "We've got to stop meeting like this, Peggy--Rod walker is getting suspicious!... Italy regards the French move to the South Coast of Spain, a direct threat to the homeland. Coupled with the build we expect in marseilles the movement of the

French Fleet is tantamount to an Act of War. If you want normal, neutral relations with Italy, Pete, you'd better reconsider your upcoming sets of moves very carefully...As for "turkey," the Crown Prinz said on his way to his zeppelin Harlan Allison, "they should be advised that I am taking personal command of the newly launched Italian 3rd Fleet, on the flagship Swinehund."

THE DIPLOMATIC POUR

LARRY ST CYR: Dear Eric, I presume that you are referring to me when you said, "One player even sent in orders based on the results in I27." in the latest issue of THE DIPLOMAT.

I will answer this accusation. First, I have approximately fifty regular and variant games of Diplomacy going, as well as the one I am running. Second, I am in my freshman year of college. Third, your magazine comes in approximately every three to four weeks, sometimes more. With these circumstances, it is hard to see how I can keep track of my moves I send in. I admit that the moves you published looked slightly funny to me, but I thought that that was due to the length of time between when I sent them in and the time the issue came. I never thought that you would be dumb enough to publish a fake DIPLOMAT, the real one's bad enough.

/*The following is part of a two page reply I sent to Larry*/ Dear Larry, I also said, "A player should keep track of what moves he made. If a game means anything to him, he should know when a Gamesmaster makes a mistake." How much does a game mean to a player? Well in your case, with 50 games, you must have paid a game fee for many of those games, and since the average is about \$3 per game, you must have about \$150.00 invested in the games in fees, alone. Now figuring the cost of a letter at about 8¢, and figuring that a player will write notes to three players and the Gamesmaster each move, and figuring about 17 game moves per year, this comes to \$5.44 per game, per year. Or for you, with 50 games, this comes to an extra \$272 per year to keep it going. Then there's the matter of time. Say you spend 1/2 hour per game move. This comes to 25 hours per move or about one day out of every 20.
/*In my letter I made mistakes in calculation which made these figures too small.*/

Well, anyway, you are spending \$150 plus \$272 per year, and 5% of your time, and you cannot see the need for keeping records? This is a costly business you have going, and it should be worth your while to keep records. You could get manila folders, and keep carbon copies of your moves. This wouldn't take much time, relatively speaking, and it would help to protect your investment.

Admittedly, THE DIPLOMAT has been irregular, but that is improving. Your last line indicates that you do not (to say the least) hold me in high esteem. I assure you that the feeling is NOT mutual. From what I've seen you could be one of the best tacticians around, but tactics is not enough, You must also have a great deal of strategic, and diplomatic ability to get ahead in this game. I think you could have these qualities, too, if you only kept records.
