I won't carry this too far, but you may see issues only once a month or such. Then again, you may see them quite regularly.

I further reserve the right to publish anything I want to. Poetry, art work, press releases, lexicographies of dirty words, essays, jokes, etc. But no strategy articles. They bore me. I'll just let von Metzke and his idiot friends fool with those things.

Rules will be my own. This is to be understood to mean the book rules except in cases of confusion, where my opinion will be law. When I set a precedent it will hold throughout.
