CONSTANTINOPLE: Count Berchtold, Foreign Minister of Austria, visited here today and was given a private audience with the Sultan. It is rumoured that the Sultan's ill-starred Peace Pact may yet have a good chance of lasting. The Sultan Abd-al-Amid formally declares war on France.

PARIS: Emperor Artus Magnus, in his first major decree since assuming power in the Great Hangover Coup Sunday morning, today declared British claims to the Pas de Calais "a mere mouse's growl."

The Frankish Emperor also ordered the First and Second legions out of the Spanish March to bolster Imperial power in the North against possible invasion by barbarians. Meanwhile, Artus ordered the Atlantic Fleet to Picardy and the Third Legion to Burgundy.
