This rather late issue then is a bit larger than usual, but will not act to knock anything off your subscriptions (this year will have 55 weeks, as far as subs are concerned). At any rate, we're sorry, and it won't happen again.

FROM CHRIS WAGNER: Those of you who subscribe to S&T will be very pleased to know that the May-June issue will have been in the mail for some time, and should be in your hands by now. Even so, you may be wondering "What causes these infernal delays anyhow?", and rightly so. Well, let me see now...

To understand S&T's rather annoying publishing schedule one must understand something of exactly who puts the magazine together and how Project Analysis Corporation came to be. In the spring of 1967, a group of wargame enthusiasts stationed in Japan with the Air Force started investigating the feasibility of producing a quality wargaming with limited resources. We had much experience with the games (and knew others experienced in various related fields), but none had any at all with publishing. Our early issues strongly attest to that. After gaining permission from the Air Force to engage in an outside activity of this nature (3 months of paper-work), and researching the various laws concerned with publishing overseas, and putting together a few hundred dollars, and establishing a United States outlet, and several other major projects, Volume I Number 1 was produced and distributed to 120 paid subscribers and about 500 others we thought would be interested.

Gradually, S&T became a better magazine as we all gained experi-

ence, brought in more professional people, and dug up more money. By the end of 1967, S&T had a circulation of well over 1000 and had lost \$1200 of a total investment of \$5000. Nobody has ever drawn a salary from the business as it now stands; only contributors who were not financially involved were paid for their work.

Project Analysis Corporation is simply the same business in the corporate form. Incorporation became possible when I left the service and was able to establish a more permanent base in New York. It was desirable because several people had invested money in S&T purely as a financial venture, and their interests had to be protected. Stock in the company is not presently available, and would be a poor bet anyhow.

Since no one is connected "full time" with the company, and since my children have the disturbing habit of eating, Project Analysis is run during what free time I'm left after working for a living. Hence, the sometimes-late (or was that sometimes-on-time?) publishing.

"But you charge professional rates for your magazine and I have a right to professional service" say the subscribers (again, and rightly so), True, and we are doing everything consistent with survival of the magazine to provide just that. The May-June issue contains the work of our first truly professional artist, Redmond Simonsen, and future issues will contain much better edited copy, again by professionals. We are able to do this now because for the last six months, PAC has been showing a profit. This profit is being turned back into better magazines and better service just as fast as possible.

Because we are attempting to market the magazine through hobby shops, and because we are encouraging advertising, the image of PAC we present is, of necessity, a professional one. Anyone familiar with the publishing field or the business world in general knows why this is so important. So forgive this vanity; it results in more for your money and a gradually improving level of quality all the way around.

MOVE ANALYSIS: By removing rather than retreating his southern fleet, the Russian player is evidently making some concession to the Turkish (and/or possibly the Austrian player). The "Spring 1902" moves ((below)) would indicate that this move was to appease the Turkish ruler.

The heavy construction of fleets indicates relative peace along the internal frontiers of Europe, and marked antipathy between those nations with contiguous coastlines. ((And that about exhausts the possibilities of reading motives into the Winter moves... a dangerous practice in any case.))

LONDO "Norway declares war on Sweden," announced the new Prime Minister of the former country in London. This at a ceremony of dedication for a new fleet at the London shipyards. "This fleet will be used to carry the Norwegian ambassador to Sweden upon its conquest" -- stated Big Brother, as the champagne flowed.

INNSBRUCH (December 1901) James Nathaniel Shorey Reports
(International News Service Features)

The people of this peaceful town are adjusting rapidly to the German occupation, although they do not understand why German forces suddenly swept through the passes into their town. Up in the hills, however, Croatian soldiers of the Austrian Empire have savagely attacked a German patrol, slaughtering its officers in a manner which decency forbids me to report. In this strangest of wars, the strangest event of all is the refusal of Austria to acknowledge that there is a war at all. When questioned about the status of relations between the Dual Empire and the Peerireich, the Chancellory of the Holy Roman Dominions of the Faithful gave this reporter no answer at all.

It is reliably reported, however, that Austrian armories are working around the clock, and I have seen Magyar drillmasters training clouds of Croat and Ruthenian irregulars in both Vienna and Illyria. Where they are destined is not known.

PEERIREICH Contracts with Krupp and Co. for an additional 43,000 greenebean shooters, 12,000 giant greenebean launchers, and 120 greenepca boosters. Contracts with Leibowitz and Sons for an additional 23 garbage schows, two rowboats, four imperial yachts, and four Thresher class subs.

BERLIN Peerialle (24 December 1901) Meeting the the Peericlaque in a special emergency session this evening in the residence of the Grand Peericrat, Johann von

Ralstonstadt, the Peerichancellor of the Peerireich Gustav Adolfus Augustus, issued a number of important instructions to the Government. First he ordered his Peericrat of Foreign Affairs (PEERIMESS), the Baron Boom-Boom McCorquodale to Moscow to sign a non-aggression and mutual defense pact with Russia. He then ordered the Assistant Peericrat of Intelligence (PEERIWEECIA), Charles de'Careei, to London to assure the English Government of the Peerireich's intentions of standing by her earlier commitments. In between appointments he met with the Ambassador of the Maldive Islands and agreed that the Peerireich would sponsor their admission to the International Peeristic Conclave. The Peericlaque also dispatched Marshal von Bulow to Paris for consultations with the Frencian Government following the establishment of a joint Pea-Greene Line between Paris and Berlin. The Peericlaque also issued a communique denying the the Peerireich was in any way responsible for the mysterious explosion that rocked Lafayette, California, in late November.

SUFFIELD EXPERIMENTAL STATION (25 December 1901 Ralstonstadt: In a joint announcement from here, Cape Cassanova and Peerimunde the Peerireich Space Exploration and Manipulation Agency (PEERIGRAB) today announced that the Peerireich had first successfully orbited a man in a space capsule on Christmas Eve.

CAPE CASSANOVA Director Montred Zelzanoloff of the Cape Cassanova Space Works today, 25 December, congratulated the Peerireich on its brilliant space achievement. It announced that the Cape had begun tracking the Peerireich craft shortly after 12:00 am yesterday. Within an hour the Cape was picking up transcripts of broadcasts, some of which have been released:

"Yes, this is Yellow-bird. All systems are A-OK. The bourbon is a little flat but the seltzer water is fine.

"Yes, the pretzels are fine.

"No, I haven't seen it yet. Where? Really, I thought that was part of the oxygen system. It's called LSD? What does that mean? Oh reall... say, it's not bad. However, don't you think it's the wrong stuff for a mouth wash?

"Yes, the altimeter is rine. However, the air pressure is getting low. Well, I tried that but nobody put a spray bomb in here.

"Oh, what's this? No, the little red knob down below the seat here? You're kidding... you mean if I pull....."

"HELLO? HELLO? This is Ground Control. Are you there?"

"Up, up, and away in my beautiful balloon...."

"LADIES AND GENTLEMEN WE TAKE YOU TO PEERIMUNDE FOR A SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT FROM DR. JOHN MCCALLUM, DIRECTOR OF THE SUFFIELD EXPERIMENTAL STATION....."

"Good evening. I greatly regret to inform you that this evening Captain Herschel Dayan of the Peerireich Space Exploration and Manipulation Agency was killed in an accident aboard his spacecraft the BAGEL Ist. Capt. Dayan was launched about 2 minutes after midnight and after achieving orbit and completing two and one half revolutions

around the Tel Aviv airport his craft was lost from tracking on our radar. It is believed that the Captain's craft was lost through mechanical error. The Peerireich has announced that Captain Dayan will be buried in the Hall of Heroes at the Peeristag.

SUFFIELD EXPERIMENTAL STATION (28 December 1901) In a candid interview with reporters here Dr. Jon McCallum today admitted that the losstt of the BAGEL Ist had hurt the Peerireich space efforts but denied that it had resulted in a cut-back in appropriations for the B'nai Brith and United Jewish Appeal. Dr. McCallum confirmed that further programs were projected and announced that the second launching would go off as scheduled in early 1902.

DUGWAY TESTING CENTER (29 December 1901) In this top secret sub-station of the Suffield Experimental Station where many top secret experiments are carried on, the latest series of efforts by Drs. Reinsel, Koning, and O'Peeri to perfect a Greener-than-Greene Brain Purifier have been unsuccessful. After experimenting on thousands of chinchillas and sheep, the Drs. admitted that nothing could be found to purify the mind of a Greene. However, the Drs. were having great success with their plans to perfect the use of Peeritalasis for the control of greenerabbits and other greener-than-thou creatures. The Drs. re ued to comment on reports that they have successfully achieved the prpduction of hundreds of thousands of hamsters capable of spreading peeri-thought throughout the known and unknown world.

MOVE COMMENTARY The net effect of the Austrian confusion over piece location may prove to be less grave than might at first be supposed. Mistaking the Army Budapest for an Army in Vienna prevented Austria from capturing Tyrolia, but it had little effect otherwise. If the Army Galicia is retreated to Vienna, the piece lineup will be same as if no mistake had been made (save for control of Tyrolia).

Note should be made of the English tactics this season, for they are excellent. Rather than building in Edinburgh, then supporting the Army Norway with the Fleet North Sea, while edging Fleet Norwegian to the Barents and Fleet Edinburgh to the Norwegian, Reinsel has temporarily conceded control of Norway to Russia, while positioning himself for a potentially far more devastating raid this Fall. His position is now highly flexible, while Russia's is not. The "Fall 1902" maneuvers should be illuminating.

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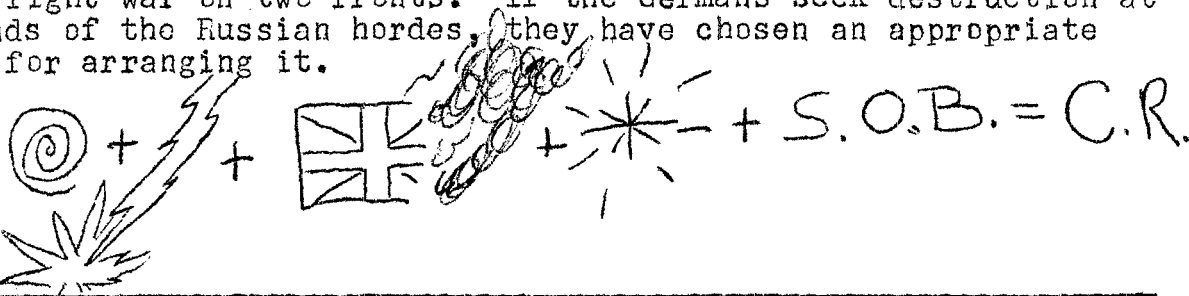
LONDON to WESTERN EUROPE "Should any ship of a foreign nation without written permission choose to enter the English Channel this shall be accepted as an 'act of war' by his majesty's government! Beware!" -- B.B.

VIENNA The War Ministry today noted that the withdrawal of Turkey from the war against Russia has left the Austro-Hungarian and British Empires as the only realms left fighting the most dangerous enemy in Europe. Unless the German Reich ceases its senseless invasions of Austrian territory and withdraws to the German homeland, Austria will have no choice but to conclude as good a peace as possible with the Tsar, leaving Germany to fight a Russia whose Southern and Southwestern fronts are secure.

The Dual Empire has no reason to desire war with the German Reich, and cannot understand this unprovoked attack.

The real threat to the peace in Europe is Russia. The Russian Emperor has used his deadly persuasive arts, reinforced no doubt with threats of physical harm to the Turkish commander, to secure peace with his Southern neighbors. The English face a thankless task if they seek to reduce this Russian menace alone, yet Austria cannot fight war on two fronts. If the Germans seek destruction at the hands of the Russian hordes, they have chosen an appropriate method for arranging it.
