MOVE ANALYSIS "Spring 1903" is a season of revelations. Turkey seems to have declared himself against Austria, since his move to Serbia lends itself to few other interpretations. Likewise, Germany has for the first time openly moved against England, who seems likely to pay for his seizure of Sweden with the loss of Edinburgh. Russia, who at first seemed to be at war with all his neighbors, now appears only to be at war with England.

Look for the alliance structure, never very stable in this particular game, to undergo massive reshuffling in the near future.

Meanwhile, Italy has been put in an awkward situation as a result of being outguessed in the Venice-Rome situation. Had Franco moved A Tus-Rom rather than to Venice, Italy would have been in the clear. This is hardly the case now.

GERMANY CASTS FATE TO WINDS, EMBARKS ON HOLY WAR AGAINST TARSAN

KIEL: OFFICIAL COMMUNIQUE OF THE PEERIREICH NAVY:

Upon the instruction of the Grand Peericrat, Johann von Ralstonstadt, I have ordered the entire Peerireich Navy to take to the High Seas to protect the territorial integrity of the Peerireich against an attack planned by a coalition of western-imperialistic-aggressive-capitalistic-intelligensia-bourgeois-English-greeneistic Plots. The Peerireich has conclusive evidence of an attempt by the Greenian Conspiracy to undermine the long-time Anglo-Peerian friendship and bring about a war between our nations. Therefore, the Navy has been ordered to prepare to resist the attack. PEERISITES, MAN YOUR BATTLESTATIONS. /s/ HEINREICH PEERIMIER, ADMIRAL OF THE PEERIST FLEETS.

ST. PEERIGRAD (3 January 1903) War Command Central: Acting upon the advice of the Peerircraft Agency (PIA) the Supreme Peericrat has ordered all Peerireich Forces to take to the seas against the English. This action was ordered by the High Command following the call of a Holy Crusade against England by the Archbishop of St. Peerigrad, Jacque Cardinal Peericelli. Among those who answered the call were: Sir Charles Wells, the Viceroy of Cleveland, who has been recognized by the Supreme Peericrat as the legitimate ruler of England, and the Governor-General of Rantoul, Sir Rodney "Dumphy" Walker. In an interview with STABIT, the St. Peerigrad Free Press Journal, sources close to the Supreme Peericrat said: "Actually, the reason we're attacking him is because of his nasty and vile attacks on Charles Wells, who we don't know at all but who can't be as bad as Reinsel... and at least not half as crude... or cheap."

The Secretary of Peeriaffairs today announced the Peerireich would stand by her pledge to aid Russia in the defense of Sweden and hoped that a Peerireich occupation, if successful, would pave the way for a swift return of Russian forces to the state. The Secretary denied reports that the declaration of war against England was prompted by English rejection of Peerireich demands that Sweden be ceded to her following the English seizure of St. Petersburg.

HELGOLAND (5 January 1903) The 3rd Peerireich Fleet arrived here today to be greeted by thousands of cheering islanders. It was a stirring sight as the main Peerireich Battle Fleet steamed into port: the Puebloberg, the Koningberg, Keidelberg, and Lindenberg. The fleet has been strengthened by the addition of the battlecruisers: KLAUS KAPPLERSTRUCK, HANS CHRISTIAN TURNERSCHNEIZTEL, and GRETCHEN. The move of the fleet is seen as a continuing part of the Peerireich policy of strengthening her natural defenses, in this case the huge Greenebean farms located on Helgoland.

TIERRA DEL GUNO (6 January 1903) The Peerireich cruiser HUGGEN DE KISSEN arrived here today and seized the island from its French guards. Capt. Johann der Fligen-dernun, commander of the ship, placed the island under the cruiser's

guns and banned all free speeches and publication of the island's only newspapers, the SUNDAY AFTERNOON GAZETTE, and NOWHERE.

SACRAMENTO (10 January 19??) Gov. Ronald Reagan, announcing that he was not announcing at this time whether he would or would not announce that he was a candidate for any office, today appointed a special commission to investigate conditions in the California Home for the Bewildered. The Governor has promised the commission will include such well-qualified members as Paul Neuman, Shirley MacLaine, Gary Began, Isodra Wycoff, Jesse Unruh, and Hans Tabor. The Home has become a political bombshell since it was revealed that it was being used as a prison for opponents of the Governor and his policies and was being secretly run by members of the Bavarian Illuminati. Meanwhile, Gen. Hershey Lewis, Commander of the State Militia has announced the call up of several hundred thousand Californian national guardsmen to put down disturbances in Hillsborough, El Cajon, Cement City, Dixieland, and Harper Valley following the convention last week of the National PTA (PEERISTS TRADE ASSOCIATION) in Harper Valley. The Convention, broken up by disorders caused by members of the Harper Valley delegation following a vote against their demands for lifting of skirt-hems by six inches, has been suspended. HARPER VALLEY (13 January 19??) Meeting under the guard of thousands of State Militiamen, the PTA Convention here today nominated Postmaster General Lawrence O'Peering to run for President. Whoopee Dooo! In his acceptance speech O'Peering announced he would campaign extensively for the office of President. Confusion surrounds the announcement since it may lead O'Peering into a confrontation with Gov. Reagan, who is thinking of running, or is rumored to be thinging (this is definitely a rumor and it has never been confirmed that the Governor does or can think) of running for President on an illegitimate-son ticket. Anyway, the election in Periland should be interesting.
