Below is a public service announcement which appeared in St George and the Dragon, issue 80, and thanks to Bob Sergeant, is being reprinted here in its entirety.

**PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT\*\*\*\*\***

Lately a number of zines a publicizing Larry Peery's announcement of a revival of Xenogogic. Be warned.

When I entered the hobby, Larry Peery's Institute for Diplomatic Studies was offering a full-scale book on how to play with a chapter devoted to each country. He delivered the first chapter on Austria, then declined to provide anything further. He also did not refund any money, although about a year later I heard that he was coming back into the hobby (about '76) and would refund the money. I do not know of anyone who received a refund.

About two years ago, I received the mailing that seems to have gone to all publishers lately announcing the "forth-coming" publication of Xenogogic. No issues ever came out although Peery asked people to send in their game fees.

Last month, I received the same mailing I received 2 years ago. Still announcing the "forthcoming" Xenogogic. I recommend no one send Peery any money until they have an actual issue of Xenogogic in their hands, and they have reason to believe it won't be the only one. I also caution publishers about recommending Peery without further investigation.

This is Whitestonia, a Fun-Zine brought to you by John Caruso 42-34 Saull St Plushing, NY 11355 212 353-9695. Within these pages you'll find games, profiles, Kathy's Korner and much, much more. Did you know people are still asking me who puts out Carrier Strike. For once and for all, Milton Bradley does (you know the guys that made Life). The game can probably be found in most childrens toy and game store, like Playworld, Toyworld, Toy-R-Us, a tc. Cost should be about \$8.00. If you can't find it on your game shelves in your neighborhood, I suggest you write to Milton Bradley. I'm sure they'll tell you either where to find it or will send you a price for it if you care to buy it directly from them.
