ANALYSIS:
Sorry for missing lately, but I've been to California for vacation.
It was nice with no rain, no humidity, cocl nights and sunny days! It was quite an experience. However, (sorry Californians!) I wouldn't want to live in Southern California because it's too crowded and smoggy. Wall to wall suburbia! Yeech.

1978IS has developed along the predicted lines. Apparently Englan is sticking with France. I do not see any changes in the game nor do I expect England to stab France. England will have enough strength to keep France in line. Of course, if England WANTS to attack France, he should be able to do so by 1906. Any sooner would be risking some sort of miracle anti-English alliance, which however, I don't see happening.

Turkey, as expected, is picking up some defensive strength, but all the other countries in between are suffering badley! Well, that's the way the game goes. And, why did England win this game ? Simply because he forged ahead in the beginning of the game. He did that by managing to get everyone else messed up with their alliainces. Sometimes, you don't have to do that! It is only sometimes necessary to sense who's going where and then figuring out the long-term prospects of that basic intuition and picking out your best strategy. So, the trick is guessing the first semi-permanent alliance structures so you can fight it or aid it from your own country's viewpoint. It sometimes pays off to remain uninvolved, as England did in the early stages, and other times it is best to harry and jump in and take advantage of a situation. The winner is usually the one who sees how the game is shaping up, alliance-wise, and then doing what he must do to stop or help it. Later, tactics become important, but no amount of tactics can overcome that early strategic decision.

I'm looking for England to raise more armies in order to strengthen his German-Russian fronts. Fleets will come later if he decides to attack France by sea(he could attack by land!). The others can build what they like without influencing the game much!

It was brought to my attention that the error of not listing Russias A Bud could have meant a change of orders for one of the other players. I'll try to explain why I did what I did. First, I did not see the error untill I sat down to adjudicate the game. In I had seen it earlier I would have sent a postcard (I usualy do). Me pet peeve is to have to delay a game unless it is the only choice. I felt the error trivial and went ahead with the game . I'm sorry if I caused any problems, but I really didn't feel it important enough to make you wait another month. I wish that you would report errors to me right away so I could send out corrections. The concession to Russia failed. I have a propsal for a Rus/Tur dread PLEASE vote on this with your orders. Not voting is a 10 vote.

The following is an updated Calhamer point count rating list complete through the games reported in <u>Everything</u> #42. It contains the standings of all players who have accumulated more than two Calhamer points during their playing careers (*)

The Calhamer standings tends to be an historical document just like the all time Home Run records that are cherished by baseball forms It gives players an oppurtunity to compare their results against the careers of other competitors since the beginning of postal Dipomacy. The Calhamer ratings, like many career ratings systems, do have a tendency to reward longevity. Nevertheless, one does not accumulate more than 2 Calhamer points (which implies that the player participated in at least 3 victories) without some degree of Diplomatic proficincy.

At this point, the ratings have a couple of other flaws that should be noted. First, European games completed during the past 15 months have not yet been reported in <u>Everything</u> yet. Consequently, the score of many of the English and continental players may be understated. Dennis Agosta has indicated that he plans to correct this situation

shortly.

Secondly, apparently the results of a growing number of games have simply not been reported in <u>Everything</u>. It is not known exactly what the problem is, but if an individual feels that he has won more points than recorded, it may be worthwhile to verify that all of his victories have been reported in <u>Everything</u>. The following are the Calhaner point count ratings as of July 15th.


