THROWN INTO THE BREACH-or, the plight of the standby player. Lee, Sr.

I've been asked a lot about the role of a standby player. This is an attempt to give my point of view on these questions. Keep in mind that I'm not talking about those 14 & 15 center positions that come up every so often (those amount to a "gift" win in most cases), but I am discussing the 2-6 center positions that come up a lot. These are usually created when a player loses interest for one reason or other.

First, how important is a standby position? Well, his most important function, in my opinion, is to help the G.M. A standby player will help avoid the GM from making important decisions (removals, etc), and allows the GM to remain in a neutral position where he belongs. Often a crucial removal or retreat will affect the entire balance of the game. I know I've had to make some GM decisions I wish I didn't have to make.

The next important function of the standby is to try and be aware of the game situation, who's allied with who, etc. Often a standby position is part of a stalemate line that the others are trying to preserve at all costs. If the position is important to the others, they will most likely (and should!) write to you explaining the situation.

Another type of standby position is the one where you are being destroyed by somebody. Even this one is important to game balance, as without your moves and supports, one or more players might have an advantage in picking up your centers without a fight. In fact, if it is positive that a country is in Civil Disorder to stay, units can be shifted to other fronts because there is no fear of that country attacking you any more, and you can pick up it's centers at your leisure. Most GMs will never resurect a country once in CD, but be sure. I had a GM once resurect a CD country after it had been idle for 4 years!

Another question is should a standby write the others? Yes, to a degree. This depends on your own feelings towards being a standby. I've always felt that the other players should have the responsibility to write the standby and inform him of whats been happening. The new player should then respond and verify what he's going to do. This type of correspondance is usually more important than any you might initiate If they don't write, they can't blame you for any action you might take !

So, in my opinion, a standby should take over the position in as consciencetious a manner as possible. I know of a few people who don't. These types often use the position as a devise for revenge on a former (or present) enemy in another game. Sometimes these guys come in pairs and will both get into the game. If so, the game is a shambles from that point on. Unfortuneatly the GM can't do much about this unless he's aware of a particular relationship, and doesn't use that player in that situation. This is why there is a school of thought that standbies shouldn't be used at all. I can see the reasoning for this, as I've had several games ruined by some jerk standby. However, in most cases, I would much rather have a standby than a CD position.

Finally, can a standby win a game? SURE! There are a few people who have made a career out of winning standby positions. However, I never take over a standby position with that thought in mind. I do it for the reasons that I've outlined above. If I should get a chance to win I'm not going to pass it up, but I personally do not place much value on standby wins or draws, simply because I didn't create the position in the first place. There is a lot of debate about this among ratingskeepers, and it will probably never be resolved.

So there you have it folks, my mutterings have been printed again. I hope that this will answer most of the questions that were asked. Anybody want to join my standby list?
