In Diplomacy World #26, Mark Berch writes a short piece about the use of nationalities when supporting or convoying units of a foreign power. He states that the rulebook doesn't specify that you have to mention other countries nationality. For example: Austria supports Italian A Ven-Tyr. I would write; A Tri (s) Ita A Ven-Tyr. If one of you sent me that order without the Ita in front of the order I would say that you have NSU as A Ven and the Italian move would fail (if it were opposed). Well, guess what? I'm still going to do it that way no matter what Mark says in Dw. Why? Because most of the GM's I've played under during the 62 years that I've been at this game do it that way. I beleive that it is a very important tactical ploy to miswrite this order on purpose and try to explain it away to your ally as a mistake. So, let the Why Me houserules be amended to the effect that; "you must state the nationality of a foreign powers unit that you are supporting or convoying". This will avoid any of you nitpickers from telling me that I'm not doing things according to the rulebook. OK?

A FAKE REVIEW.

Actually the title is a bit misleading since this is not a fake review, it is a real review of a fake subject. Maybe I should just leave it at 'The subject is fakes'. The word fake can be found in the

Diplomacy Lexicon under 'V'.

Dec 28th, 1979. Volkerwanderung from Van Nuys, Cal. I had only been involved in pbm Diplomacy for about 4 months so this was my first live encounter with a fake. It was appropriate that it was the Christmas Volker fake. Highlites included SKRUBARKER, a new game opening up with Buddy Tretick aliases playing 4 of the 7 countries, a new spelling policy; some rather silly moves in some of the real games. Austria in 79IF builds F Vienna, in vestisapo spr '01 France ordered A Mar + F Bre (s)A Par-Gas and in my game (79IR) we are chastised for attacking the only female player in the game.

Mar 26th, 1980. Volkerwanderung (again) from Bakersfield, CA. By now I am checking my code number on every issue of Volker that I receive so I know right away that this is a fake. Among other items Al Rodriguez joins Bruce Linsey, Andy Harris, David Barker and the world famous Buckalew brothers in confessing to the original fake. SKRUBARKER makes it to Spr '01 but no farther and, funnily enough, there is an article

on the world's greatest hoaxes.

April 5th, 1980. Volkerwanderung from prescott, Ariz. This is the 'special Arizona issue' purported to be a mid-vacation issue from the real Bob Arnett. At this point I knew it was a fake before I opened the mailbox. Inside the zine are a few clues as to who faked the Christmas Volker and a \$100 reward for information about the culprits behind it. In the only game related information inside, the players in Cutzar are informed that one of them has been thrown out of the game for deceiving the GM but aren't told who.

April 13th, BARKER (a real good zine) from Santa Ana, CA. I was fooled by this change of pace but I wasn't going to shell out \$10 US (\$50 canadian) to sub to it even though future issues were going to have a Kathy Byrne nude centerfold. Other highlites were: Games named after pbm diplomacy celebrities with the appropriate wrinkles in th house rules to reflect thier quirks and the almost manditory confession by Dave Barker(?) that he was responsible for the fake christmas

Volker.

April 16th, 1980. <u>Volkerwanderung</u> from LA, Cal. This volker of a different colour is the last fake Volker that I have received. What seems to be the hold up? The whole issue is dedicated to revealing who did the fake Christmas Volker without actually giving out names.

July 18th, 1980. Eggnog from Milwaukee, WI. Somebody slipped because I received 2 identical 6 page quintuple issues from Wladyslaw Baumeister. Features were a 3 page 'famous photographs'section, 76IH in which pieces vanish for no reason, a eulogy of Curtiss Gibson, and a new game start in which Konrad Baumeister plays Germany, Italy and Russia. I'm still unaware of the significance of getting 2 of these. Is anybody missing one?

July 29th, 1980. Brutus Bulletin from Northern Va. John Michalski had been warning his subbers that Jack Masters was about to fake a BB so it came as no surprise when a BB came, with all the pages of the same size, that it was a phoeny. A lot of effort went into faking this. Letters were allegedly written by Mark Berch, Dave Perlmutter, Curt Gibson, Bob Osuch etc. However if the uniformity of page size didn't tip you off the press should have. When the dirtiest press is, 'the first person to touch Warsaw is a rotten egg', you know it's not the real BB.

Aug 16th, 1980. Black Frog from Van Nuys, Cal. Didn't I start this article with Van Nuys? 2 months after first going to general circulation the first fake Black Frog appears. This fake is an expensively done colour repro of a Kathy Byrne centerfold. ((continued next page))

((Fake review)) It also has fake Leeder poll results, some serious charges against Dave Perlmutter (never actually mentioned), notice of an all homosexual game opening in Voice of Doom and a phoney winner in Jack Master's 'name the Black Frog' contest. In later real issues of Black Frog Jack narrows down the field of persons with reasons to fake Black Frog to 200.

Sept 27th, 1980. Voice of Doom from Utica, NY. The 'Mellow Yellow' issue. I don't know why it took so long to fake VOD since with Bruce Linsey's active participation in making waves I thought it would have been done earlier. Most of the 'zine was fake game results and press. In BF #19 Jack Masters takes credit for this one but denies doing any of the other fakes thus destroying his credability. Oct 18th, 1980. Cheesecake from No Suburban, Ill. I have watched-and enjoyed-a large number of movies over the years. I am sure people would get more out of movies if they dropped thier pre-conceived notions and tried to accept the movie on it's own terms.

Let's suppose someone is off to se a "war movie". There's a good chance that in the back of his mind, he's got some general notion of what a war flick ought to be "about', and some idea of how the story should be told. This however is very unfair. War is a very complex undertaking and all sorts of stories are possible. "Patton" for an example deals with the nature of military leadership, especially the psychlogical aspects of it. "Paths of Glory" has a radically different aim, showing how war can destroy even the most minimal standards of Military justice. "Gone with the Wind" details how the horrors of war can rip a society and it's way of life to shreds. "Rome, open city" (parts of which were shot even while the Germans were still evacuating the city) dwells on the effects of war on commen citizens.

Apocalypse Now" tries (and succeeds spectacularly, in my opinion) to give the "feel" of fighting in an utterly alien enviornment, the bizzare and unexplicable. "A bridge too far" is more tradtional story-telltin, cataloging a single campaign. "Bataan" and "Guadacanal Diary" emphasize the fighting unit (squad, etc) per se, particularly a microcosim for how americans view their own (democratic within limits) society.

And so it goes. These movies are all very different. But each should be viewed with an open mind. If you feel that a war movie should have lote of exciting fighting, then yuo'll miss the point of, e.g. Paths of Glory. Yes, there are battle scenes, but the most powerful scenes are usually of the battlefield. The movie is no more about trench warfare than Close Encounters is about UFOs.

I could no more list my top 10 movies than my top 10 foods. How can one compare-rank- a lamb chop with a ripe peach? Or "sven Samuai" with "Animal House". Movies should be enjoyed on thier own terms, not

as compared with others.

As for messages', a lot of people get bent out of shape by this. Why? It makes just as much sense to complain that Charlie Chaplin movies are in Black-and white, or Tora, Tora, Tora is partly in Japanese. If the movie turns out to have a message either just ignore it (tho that risks losing part of the value of the movie) or accept it. Don't mutter to yourself that he should have made a different movie (messageless). He didn't. Instead, ask yourself; did he pick an interestin message? Did he tell it with finesse and care or did he just clobber you over the head with it? Yes, you could avoid the type altogether, but you'll miss a lot of first class movies that way. ((Phew, you sure at the opposit end of the other people who wrote in about this subject, Mark. I'm not going to try and debate you on the subject, but I personally do think that some things stand out in one's mind far above any others. I have not thought about it enough to come up with my top-ten movies, but I'm sure I could if I thought about it. Remember, it's not like I only like 10 , I've enjoyed hundreds. But, there are a few that just stand out as having entertained me far more than some of the others. As for 'message' films; I'm not against this type of film altogether but I HATE the ones that leave you depressed after leaving the theatre. I go to the movies to escape from all of the real things in lfe. I want to be entertained (laugh, kept in suspense, etc). When I leave the theatre I want to leave with a good feeling not be saddened by the plight of the poor so-and-so that got shafted. Thanks for your opinions Mark. Oh yeah!
