Gee, not one origional player shared in the draw! These are the kind of games that dep ress me as a GM, standby after standby is a real pain. Incidentally: I have credited Rick Ragsdale with the French portion of the draw as he was the player who actually sent orders in the season that the game ended. Doug, you have a lot of experience with this, correct me if I'm wrong. End-game statements follow.

England (Doug Beyerlein): I am amazed that the two major powers in this game would agree to a draw which includes France and England. I told them that I would vote for nothing less, but this game had a long way to go to it's final conclusion. I would have prefered to have played it out, but knew that I would never get a better deal for Eng. If I would have been playing Austria or Russia I would have gone for a win or at worst a 2 way draw. Whi cares (other than the GM)if it would have taken 2 game years or 20 ? I am here to play the game. Next time let's play it to the end.

Russia (Keith Mercer)Coming into this game as a stand-by I really did not have anything to lose when I took over the controls for Russia at the end of 1905. The situation when I entered the game was not that great as Russian positions go since the Austrian had just taken a stab at my predecessor. I was lucky that the Austrian was willing to negotiate and permit me some breathing room, for if he had continued his attack on me it was doubtful that I would have lasted and built myself back up as I did. What it boiled down to was my granting certain concessions, such as Munich and Constantinople, to reteain a neutral border. I granted Austria the concessions he put at me but only for one year after which the Russian assualt of Austrian Territory started. Had England stayed clear of my northern frontier I think I would have been much more successful than it turned out. In any case by the time the draw went through I had gained a strong foothold in Austrian territory and had units in Serbia and the Aegean and was in a position to move further against him.

In the north England proved to be the thorn in my side that I couldn't seem to eliminate no matter how hard I tried. He was a very determined player and under other circumstances I think he would have been a worthy ally/ The only thing I could do to England was eliminate one unit here to have another unit show up somewhere else. England's position and the inabilty to get at him prompted me to give in on the 4 way draw.

France would have been in much better shape if John Kelley hadn't dropped the position sometime back. We had just worked out an agreement between us where he would make the majority of gains in centers if he would move against England and Austria but unfortunately he decided to drop out of the hobby after the first move of the offensive we were to make. The new French player decide, apparently, to go against Austria but I failed to correspond with him like I should have and never generated the joint effort ((continued))

between our two nations as I had tried earlier with Kelley.

I never had much of a chance to know Germany or Turkey since they were both taken out of the game with my help, shortly after I had taken the position. Italy was out before I entered the picture.

I must tip my hat off to the players who came and went in this game for they really added to the complexity of the game. And a special thanks to Lee for the fine running of the game and the smoothness it seemed to have, even with all the NMRing and dropping out of players. Let's hope that all the GM's will someday be able to carry a game as you've done in this one Lee. Thanks for giving me the oppertunity to participate in one of your games.

Lee speaks: thanks for all the kind words Keith. The NMR problems in a game like this are just one of the things that have soured me on doing this 'zine. Maybe if there were more people like yourself and the others who stuck this out to the end I would have a different attitude towards publishing & GMing.

From Mark Berch((this was actually received for last issue so some of Mark's references are to # 36))

Ah, so it's depressing movies that you don't like . Well, that's certainly understandable. Why pay for what life can hand you for free! Problem is, if Hollywood avoids these, or you do for that matter, you are getting distorted views. Take war flicks; war is sometimes funny, sometimes uplifting, sometimes suspenseful, and sometimes depressing. Which means that some war movies ahould be depressing, some comidies. Plus you'll miss some good ones! You might want to avoid 'Who'll stop the Rain'?. It is depressing, as it deals with the consequences of people losing control of thier lives in dangerous times. But what a powerful movie it is! Oh well, the ancient Greeks felt that tragedy and comedy were inseperable as dramatic forms and that one could only appreciate one by seeing the other as well.

I am always pleased to get feedback from my DW editorials (IE: The one in DW 26 that you commented on in WM 36). You are certainly doing your players a service by telling them how you rule, as this avoids squabbles. And citing precedent (of other GMs) is certainly a strong reason. Such small departures from the rulebook don't really present a serious problem. However, it should be looked at as just that-a departure from the rulebook. You have in fact added a requirement not there. The rulebook does not say you have to do it, and XII, I makes it clear that it is optional. Plus Calhamer has said it wasn't his intent to make such a requirement mandatory. It adds nothing to the quality of the game. And it surely must be discouraging to new comers to be penalized for not giving information they had no way of knowing was required. Yes, most GMs in the past have required this, but I pre-

dict that this will change.

One other thing. There are other ways of deliberately miswriting an order. Indeed, why not go whole-hog and say that certain abbreviations only are permitted-e.g. only Bot. By allowing both Bot & Gob as you presently do, you are denying this ploy to someone who wants to mis-

write by using Gob.

((Mark, I go to the movies only a few times a year and when I do the last thing I want to do is leave the theatre depressed ! I go to be entertained, and depression is not entertaining in my book. I'm sure there are those who disagree with me, but it's my 4 bucks and I don't wish to use it in such a fasion. Besides, I often watch films on TV that I wouldn't pay to go see, so that gives me an oppertunity to see some of the other types. Next, there are many slight deviations from the rulebook in use around the hobby. That is why my houserules say that 'any interpretation of the rules by the GM is final' . As I see it the nationality is used in all the examples and I choose to do it that way. As far as writing orders goes, and the use of certain abreviations, I don't beleive in overburdening the players with a bunch of houserules. I try to be as fair as possible in my GMing. If one of my players uses a different abbreviation than normal, but it it clear what he means, I see no reason to penalize him. This is especially true when dealing with novice players. It leaves a very foul taste in thier mouths when they are penalized for some silly minor infraction. Personally, I wouldn't play in those 'zines that have six pages of houserules ! Damned if I want to refer to them every time I write my orders. In my opinion, houserules only have to be complete enough to prevent major conflicts between the GM and players. Aside from that my favorite houserule is for the GM to use commen sense . I only hope that this doesn't start a round of houserules discussions in Why Me? because I find that boring as hell !!
