I was diasapointed to see the letter from John Michalski with the same old dumb lines about how standbys cause him problems and spoil a game. If you had a good alliance with the dropout, you should be able to persuade his replacement to just step into the shoes of the former owner--IF you're a good diplomat. And if he were an enemy, well, you have a fresh chance to either persuade him--or trick him. Standbys present an opportunity/risk that lesser diplomats often flub, I've been helped far more than I've been harmed.

I guess wht it comes down to is why you play Diplomacy. I play for the negotiation, the intrigue, the contact with another person on whatever level. And let me tell you, CD never answers his mail. He cannot be swindled--its either too easy (you know he'll just hold) or impossible -- he won't move off target. He's no fun at all. CD is just fine if you just want to increase your chances of winning--but then you're better off with chess or solitare. I think it's good that people like Jerry Jones offer no-standby games, so that people have thier choice. But no-standbys produces less negotiation, and the to me means an inferior game.
