In the regular tournament my first day was both interesting and frustrating at the same time. I was England and had to deal with a German player (whose name escapes me right now) who played very paranoid of me right from the start. My origional plan was to wipe out France at the earliest oppertunity but the Russian (Dick Martin) and the Turk (Julie Glass) were really romping as allies. Italy and Aus were being blitzed. So I convinced Germany and France to form a 3 way with me as a means to stop the R/T alliance from winning. It worked quite well and we eliminated Russia quickly. As we began to approach the time limit I realized that I had a slim chance of winning the game. I stabbed France and went for as many centers as possible. As it turned out I finished at 17 1 One away from victory. I had to settle for a 3 way E/F/T draw. I also didn't get best England due to Robert Sacs' scoring sytem. The second day I made it to top board. For those of you who have never played on top board let me tell you, it's an experience ! I'm not going to go into all the details but it's really a dogfight. The board resulted in a 5 way draw between Germany (myself), England (John Kador), France (Bob Sergeant), Russia (Phil Cooper), And Turkey ( ??). The origional plan was to blitz Sergeant as he had the most points in the tournament. However, the cooperation was not there so Bob did end up as the overall tournament winner.

All in all I really enjoyed myself. I only hope that I'll see you all again next year in Baltimore !

You should have heard the roar of approval the people gave when I made the announcement. They've vowed to return the favor by hosting a toga party in Paris in a few seasons.

Eng game statements for 1978FL. ENGLAND: Once again, I only played the last couple of seasons in this game, so I can't comment on the long term play. In the short time I played, I did see that there were really only two possible outcomes to the game: The five way draw we had or an Austrian victory. For that reason I attempted to hold the line in the West and hoped for a stalement to end it. Luckily, the draw passed instead, and the long process of the stalemate was avoided.

ITALY: This game was my first experience as a standby and replacement. I entered the game to find a 3-way western alliance in place, dedicated to oppose Austria, which was the largest single power. Russia was gone, Turkey was on his way out.

Austria and I quickly reached agreement and linked our fortunes for

the remainder of the game.

Despite repeated proposals for restructing the alliance pattern to Germany, Lee held firm, insisting that I help him against Austria first. He always game my proposals serious consideration and a prompt response, for which I commend and thank him.

Thanks are also due to Kevin, who was the perfect ally. We were able to trust each other to the extent of swapping centers, play out phoney stab situation, and maintain clear lines of communication throughtout. I really enjoyed working with him, and hope that we can work together 9or against each other0 in the future.

Finally, thanks to Art for GMing what must have been for him an extremely boring game that last five or six gameyears, though I did

not find it so.
