## Sidney Bradshaw Fay

Professor Sidney B. Fay died last week at 91. His book, *The Origins of the World War*, and lectures delivered at Harvard in 1950-51 were important in leading me to the development of the game, *Diplomacy*. Prof. Fay paid unusual attention to the role of the individual decision maker and his contacts with his counterparts in the diplomatic world. The whole interlock of meshing and conflicting intentions, accidents, blunders, etc., was carefully explored. His work appeared from the retrospect of 1951 as something of an antidote to more nearly deterministic approaches that had become prominent later.
