RUSSIA DECLARES WAR!
AUSTRIA-HUNGARY IN TURMOIL!

1965 KL (Berlin INS) The German Reichstag today voted to request the Kaiser to abdicate by a vote of 123 - 115. Supporting the motion were the Social Democrats, the Catholic Center Party, and the Cadets. Opposed to the motion were the Junker Party, the Liberals, and the Monarchists.

The Kaiser immediately abdicated and the German Republic was established under the Presidency of former Chancellor, Robert Ward. He was granted emergency powers and a term for the duration of the war.

The first official action of the new government was the release of the following communique:

"The German Republic views with alarm the Polish attempt to incite Europe against the German Republic through semi-official publication of false reports of "unmitigated barbarism".

We must demand the immediate repudiation of Dr. Otto Pflueger and his removal from government service. Failure to take this action will greatly increase the danger to continued amicable relations between the governments of the Polish Empire and the German Republic."

(Warszawa PAP) An emergency press conference held here this morning heard Polish Foreign Minister Gen. Andrzej Sawiczewski announce a declaration of hostilities between the Kingdom of Poland and Muscovy and the Austro-Hungarian Empire!

Sawiczewski made numerous references to the Polish-Serbian Treaty of 1899 (Treaty of Lodz) and the Balkan Entente of 1900 (signed in Zurich where it was safer). Sawiczewski also said of the Austrians, "...activities of late remind us of the African Hunter who was captured by the cannibals. On being placed in the cooking-pot, the hunter exhibited his common sense, calm fortitude, and stalwart nobility in the face of danger by helping to slice the vegetables."

Sawiczewski also denounced the German Empire for "terrorist activities in Denmark" and demanded an immediate withdrawal of troops from that country. "In the meanwhile", announced the Minister, "we have closed our borders to the importation of Helgoland Bight sardines in retaliation for this atrocity." Gen. Sawiczewski would comment no further when informed that sardines are not found in the Helgoland Bight.

Following the Foreign Minister's conference, Prime Minister H.R.H. Crown Prince Theodotus announced that the new Constitution, designed to create a Parliamentary Republic out of the Kingdom, and which was rejected by one vote last Spring, was being put to a national referendum early next year. The Right-wing Union of Fascists, Agrarians, Retired Generals, and Immigrant Liechtensteinians immediately denounced the referendum as "a revisionist plot".

(Tunis WO) Today Admiral Marco Vissanio led the First Fleet into the ancient harbor of Tunis, and this backward province came under Italian rule without resistance. One shot was fired at the Admiral's flagship, the Cavour, by a gunboat commanded by the local warlord, Gotsunkinda Bey. But within twelve hours the local civil administration had yielded all authority to the Kingdom of Italy.

(Rome WO) Prime Minister Montferrat today made public the news of the conquest of Tunis.

A statement has been received from Talaat Bey, President of the Republic of Turkey. We are endeavouring to translate it for publication.

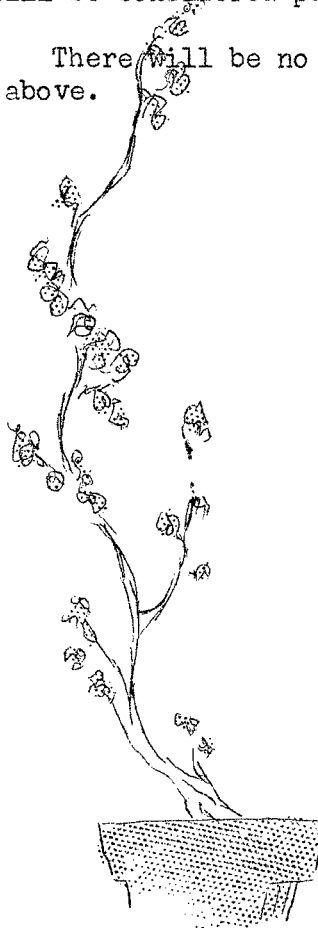
Plan A \$3.00 for the first game and \$1.00 for each additional game. The additional games must be paid for on or before the Spring 1901 move of the first game you are in.
