GERMANY AND ENGLAND REACH A MUTUAL MISUNDERSTANDING!

1965 KL (London UPI) England formally declares war on Germany. "The German atrocities against the Danes cannot go by unpunished!" -- Prince Edward

England plans to occupy Holland to protect it from Germany. "The time of Danish Liberation is not long away." -- Earl of Thompson

Meanwhile, the Admiralty is preparing a stiffly worded warning to Russia and has already stated that any Russian attack on England, or any Russian assistance to Germany, will be cause for war. England is sure that Russia doesn't want to neglect her southeastern frontier while involved wiht adventures in the frozen North.

((Methinks that the Great Earl of Thompson has at long last bit off more than he can chew.))

(Berlin UPI) The German government today rejected Russian demands that it withdraw from Denmark. It repeated the contention that the German fleet is in Denmark at the wish of King Christian IX and will remain there until he wishes it to leave, or untill Denmark is safe from aggression.

In other action, the German government released the following relating to its negotiations with England:

"The German government, foully betrayed in the attack which threatens the very existence of the German nation had decided to release the text of the agreement broken by England. This agreement, which had full English assent, is now declared null and void. The German Ambassador to London has been Recalled."

(Warszawa PAP) In a national referendum held last week, the people of the Polish Empire approve d the reformation of the government into a Parlimentary Republic by a 57% a vote. In doing so, they elected Dr. Andrzej Sawiczewski the Foreign Minister, to the first term as President of the Republic. Sawiczewski, canidate of the Christian Centre Coalition, received 53% of the votes.

As his first official statement, Sawiczewski lambasted the foriegn press for "prejudicial reporting" and accused them of rewriting press releases. ((He should be glad that we spell his name at all, let alone spell it right.))

"When I call _____ of ___ a ____, "Sawiczewski shrieked. "I expect to see in print that he is a _____ - in spite of the fact that I would now have to retract that statement had it been printed, since it is obvious that _____ of ___ is the true _____."
