(Rome) Prime Minister Claudio Constantino Paleologo, Marquess of Montferrat today announced the commissinning of the 2nd Fleet at Naples. "With the creation of this Fleet we not only equal, but surpass, the glories of ancient Rome. The Romans of old were strong only on land; we shall rule the seas as well _ _"

The Prime Minister also made public an understanding with the Austro-Hungarian Empire. "The passions of the Risergimento have cooled, and today a new era of friendship between Rome and Vienna has dawned," Montferrat announced. Observers wondered why, in the light of this 2nd announcement, the Second Italian Army had been poised on the borders of Austria for a year.

(Warszawa) The Polish Foreign Minister, Dr. Witold Plugawy, the former Ambassador to Turkey who barely escaped execution in that country some weeks ago by bobsledding across the desert to Armenia carrying a papoose as a sheild, annunced today that the Polish Republic had declared war on England for what Plugawy called "blatant violations of international law which force us to abide by the Polish-German Mutual Defense Pact of 1899." This declaration was in apparent contradiction to the statement made ten minutes later, in which Plugawy announced that within one week the Polish armies would occupy the disputed territory of East Prussia. There was no indication of a reaction from Germany, but Plugawy offered diplomats three guesses (which were universally declined). In other activities, ex-Emperor Conrad captured the Tatry Mountain Bridge Tournament Cup by defeating Olga Zle, 7-5, 3-6, 6-2, with a home run in the sixth. The game was played in a movie theatre balcony and lasted six hours, including a break for the climax of "Exodus".

TALAAAT DENOUNCES GAMESMASTERS!

(Ankara UPI) "The United Republics wil not take this vile slander lying down!" said President Talaat Bey in an address to workers at the National Prayer Mat Works at Ankara yesterday. The statement was in reference to thinly-veiled insinuations by Brannan and Cartier's west-coast publication "Wild 'N Wooly" that his nation is piratic. Talaat sighted several headlines, such as "Pirates Take Over Balkans" after the liberation of Rumania, and "Of the Care and Breeding of Pirates" at the announcement of the establishment of a Republic in Turkey.

In his address, the President freely used epithets like "Californian Barbarians", "Polish Sympathizers" and even "Demented Drooling Doodlelers". Since Talaat took office a year ago this March, he has been notoriously thin-skinned. When a lint Remover brought to his attention that W&W could havehad Austria-Hungary in mind, he was thrown out of the Hall. An ardent nationalist, Mr. Talaat has always been sensitive to critisism. but upon reading W&W, he flew into a rage. At the end of his speech he was livid and was led purple-faced from the podium by two attendant doctors.

Eyebrows were raised among observers when it was learned that a Gunboat had been sent to patrol the coast of Southern California and that the Turkish Consoul in Los Angeles has ordered the Consoulate enclosed with barb. wire. No one is quite sure what the President has in mind.
