GOVERNMENTS TOPPLE

(London UPI) King Edward has taken over the government, disolved parliment, disbanded the offices of the Admiralty, and placed all English Admirals under house arrest. His second act was to restore London as the Capital and place the English economy back on a peacetime basis. Martial law is no longer in effect. The army at Edinburgh has been ordered to take up defensive positions in Yorkshire. The King pledged to retake the North Sea and Return England to a position of security.

Further, the King announced England's mission will be peace. Teh King will cease to attack and concentrate on arranging a German-French cease-fire. A German and French non-aggression pact would be guaranteed by Emgland. England would defend the attacked and help destroy the attacker, thus insuring against a betrayal on the part of Germany or France.

(Berlin GIO) The German Republic greets with joy the news that the tyrannical former government of Britain has fallen. Desiring to give the new government every chance of proving its desires of peace with the German Republic; the Imperial War Office had ordered a cease fire on the English front, effective immediately. Only defensive actions against England will be taken untill further notice.

Ther German govednment conveys it wishes for a successful administration marked by a German-British peace upon the new government.

The news of a military coup in Britain has given the new lift to the spirits of the embattled German people. The change in government is widely regarded a presaging of a new emphasis in British Foreign Policy which may allow the Germans to end the war in the north and redouble their efforts to restore the Turkish Sultanate. The attack of France, successfully forestalled for two years is regarded as a minor threat if England in fact is friendly towards Germany. A time of shifting of alliances may greatly alter the shape of Europe this year.

(Wien Reuters) "With sinking heart, with shadows o'er all our sorrowing souls with profoundest grief at the future abysmal state into which we are being plunged," quothe Emperor Johannes Wolfgangus today to reporters who met wihh him in the Royal Vaults, "we are forced to do unto others before they do unto us. We are declaring war on the Ottoman."

Worked to an extreme emotional peak, Johannes paced the marble floor between the heaps of silver ducats on the left, and gold florins on the right. Wringing his hands in despair, and with thick beads of cold perspiration reflecting the dancing rays of golden light from the crystal chandellier above, the Emperor lamented; "We might have had peace. All Europe was eager to settle down and live in harmony and co-existence; but no, evil forces are at work to wreak havoc amongst us. Namely, greed; we want land and we're on our way."

Johannes predicted with jaunty optimism that Christmas 1902 would be spent in Sofia (Bulgaria); 1903, in Konstantinopol; and 1904, in the Cocos and Keeling islands. At this point a lecherous sneer transfixed Johannes, and he butbled, "That's our goal, the Cocos Islands. They got some damn nice broads thereabouts, I hear tell." Reporters quickly left lest the Emperor expound on his dreams and render their stories unprintable.


