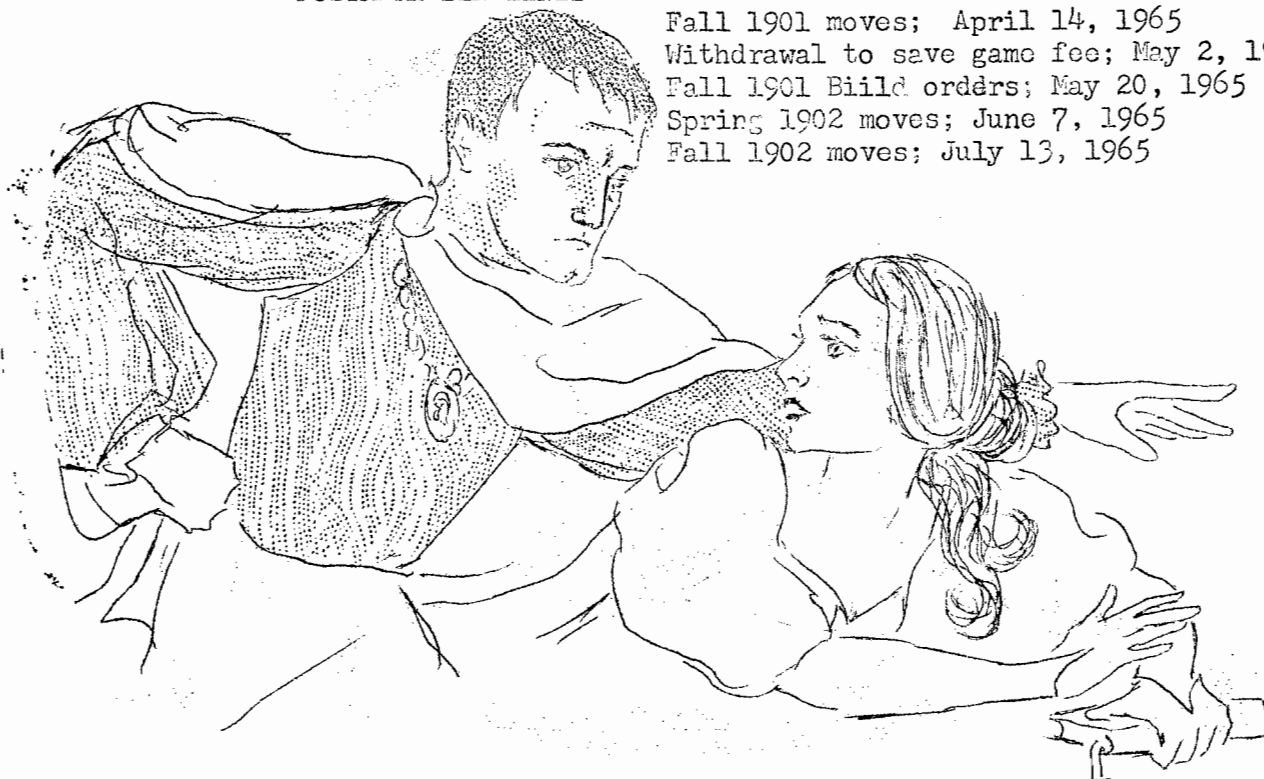

We are declaring war on the Ottoman."

Wringing his hands in despair, and with thick beads of cold perspiration reflecting the dancing rays of golden light from the crystal chandellier above, the Emperor lamented; "We might have had peace. All Europe was eager to settle down and live in harmony and co-existence; but no, evil forces are at work towreak havoc amongst us. Namely greed; we want land and we're on our way."

Johannes predicted with jaunty optimism that Christmas 1902 would be spent in Sofia; 1903 in Konstantinopol; and 1904, in the Cocos and Keeling islands. At this point a lecherous sneer transfixed Johannes, and he bumbled, "Thats our goal, the Cocos islands. They got some damn nice broads thereabouts, I hear tell." Reporters quickly left lest the Emperor expound further and render their stories unprintable.

England will recognize an English commonwealth in Denmark, a German possession of Holland, and a French possession of Belgium.

England asks that the Ruhr and Burgundy be vacated and made buffer states. England will enforce such plans, and if either Germany or France attacks each other, England will rush to the aid of the attacked and destroy the attacker.

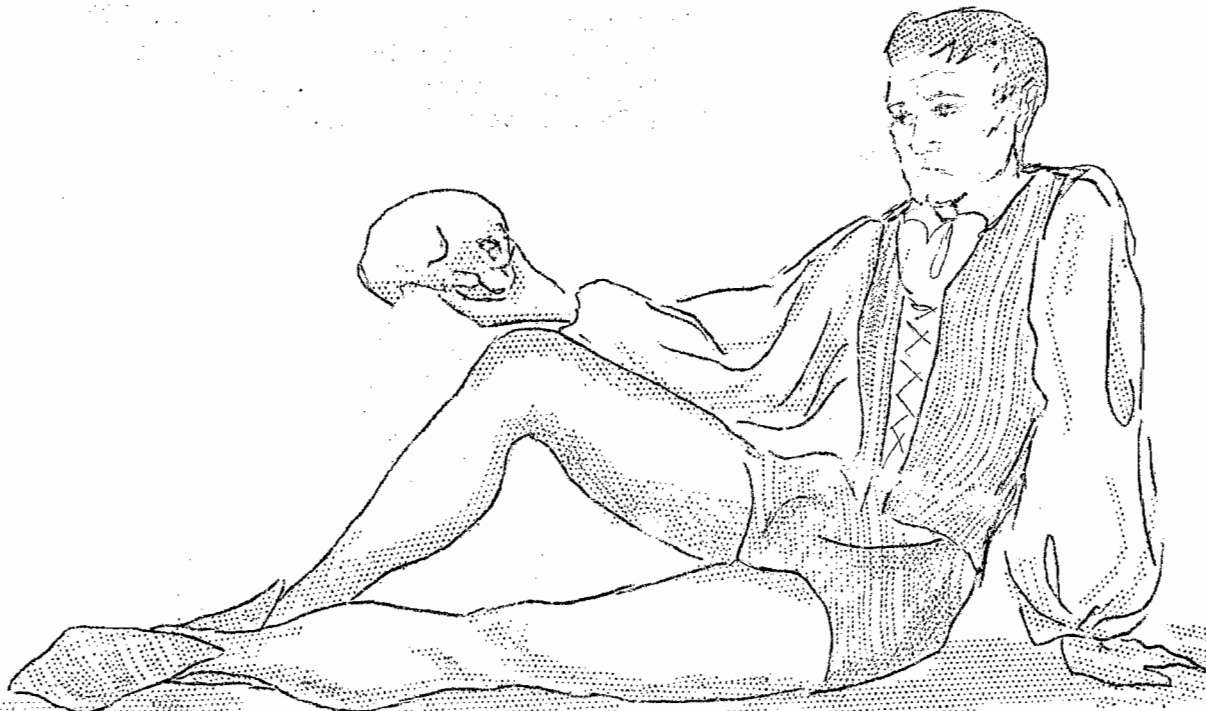
The King had "no comment" when the question of Norway was raised. The only remark was that, "If Russia had moved against England, it would have been a grave miscalculation by the Czar."

(Berlin, German Information Office) The German government welcomes King Edward's decision to return to peaceful ways. Germany has never sought to expand outside its borders save for its own protection. If the English government can complete a non aggression pact with Germany and France, the Republic will accept and abide by its terms.

The German General Staff regrets to report that in the destruction of the German 2nd Army in Holland, Colonel, formerly Crown Prince, Rupert Hohenzollern was killed. Corporal Adolph Schiklegruber has been cited for bravery in the Munich Army maneuvers in Burgundy. The General Staff has ordered all units to assume defensive positions untill further notice.

You may have your name placed on the priority lists without paying any game fees. Game fees do not become due until the game starts except for \$1.00 "additional games" under plan A. State your choice of country and game speed.

When a game list is published, each player will have two weeks to withdraw from that game list without losing his priority to play that country at that game-speed. The first time that a game list is published, it will be called a "Tentative Game List". Two issues later, it will be published again and called a "Final Game List". The game will start in the following issue except for the slow games which will start in the second issue following.
