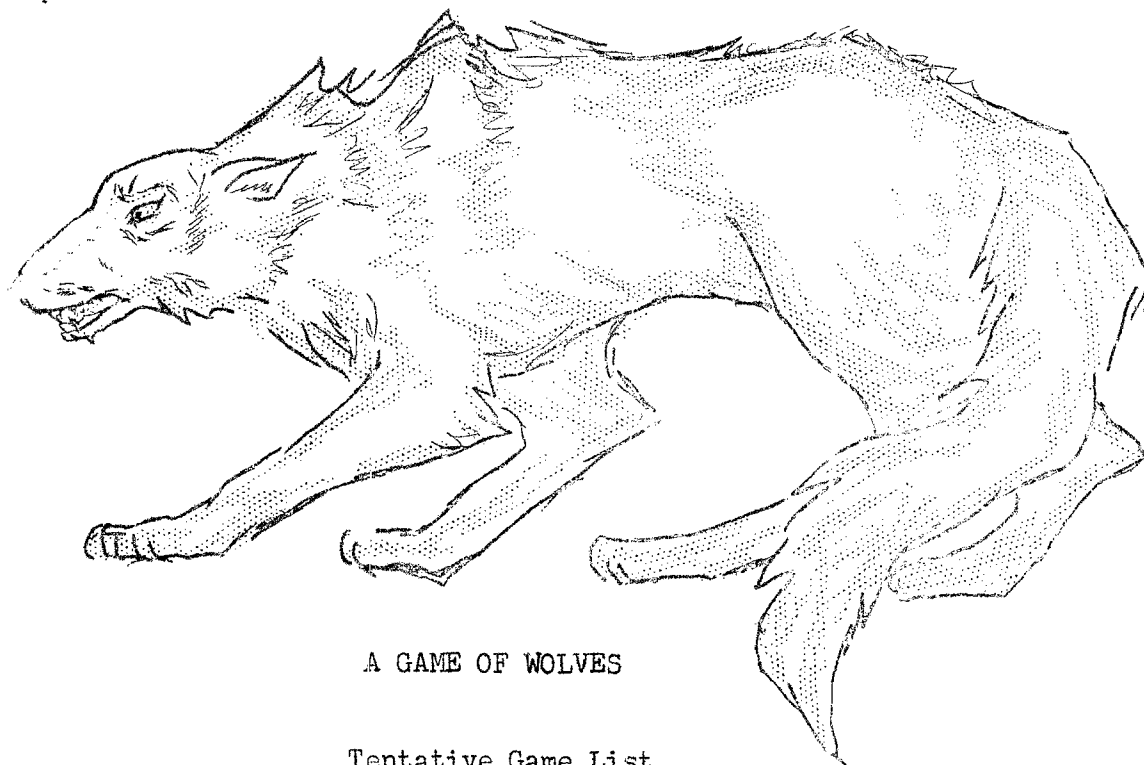

1965 KX (Reykjavik, Iceland) (With the Emperor at the Scandinavian Seal Races) Johannes Wolfgangus of Austria, after three weeks in Salzburg, arrived at this health resort tired, weak, and pale. His doctors advised a complete rest, but with a beauty pageant scheduled next week, the prospects seem remote for any rest. Therefore it appears likely that the Emperor, with his history of _____ playfulness, will return to Wien as he left it; fat, groggy, and wealthy as ever. And still tired.

Yesterday, the news arrived from home that a Bolshevik revolt in occupied Albania had been easily quelled by loyal Boy Scouts. The coup was described as "just a pocketful of worthless troublemakers."

TREACHERY IN WARSAW

(London - excerpt from the London Times) Two Russian fleets and one Russian army were in the frozen north, gathering snow for the Tsars' cocktail parties as the southern Russian frontier collapsed.

Russian plans to attack England were evident by its northern fleet construction, and "nothern movement of forces against peacefull nations."

The Russian collapse is applauded by England. "Sic Semper Tyrannus Rex", proclaimed King Edward.

(Berlin - German Information Office) In view of the Austrian move into Bohemia without prior consultation in violation of the accord of February 1901 (secret agreement) the German Government must make clear the displeasure of the German Republic. The foreign office has ordered the embassy in Vienna closed. The Austrian Ambassador has been expelled from the country. The German Republic also denounces the invasion of Warsaw and reminds her sister state that Germany stands ready to honor the Polish-German Mutual Defense Pact of 1899, as Poland earlier honored it. Polish firmness in this pact is widely credited for the allowing of the truce in the North.

(Little Poland, Antartica) The Polsih government has been reorganized in a hollow iceberg in the Antartic Territory, just discovered yesterday. Dr. Withold Plugawy, the new President, (Dr. Sawiczewski was deplorably murdered in the defense of Warsaw - now you don't have to spell his name any more), immediately announced that he was in total ignorance of what to do. It was thus decided not to do anything.

GERMANY DECLARES WAR ON ENGLAND!

(Frankfurt UPI) The German Emperor today declared "a new era of Franco-German friendship". To give credence to his sincere desire for more friendly relationships between the two nations, he announced the first of a series of shipments of gold bullions to Paris. This is intended to eventually repay the 5 billion francs France was forced to pay under the Treaty of Frankfurt ending the Franco-Prussian war. Wilhelm was also lowering the duties on some French goods, mainly those of agricultural and luxury goods.

These amazing acts almost completely reverse former German policy towards France which treated her as a probable enemy and had attempted to prevent her from ever becoming a threat to German interests. These acts are seen by most observers to be a rather obvious attempt by the Kaiser to to gain French Support in the face of the dangerous disposition of the English fleets in the North Sea and Helgoland Bight. No one is quite sure how France will react to these German advances.

(Berlin - from a statement of Policy by the Baron Dr. von Richtoven, German Minister of Foreign Affairs) I have been authorised to announce, by will of Wilhelm II, Kaiser of the Deutsches Reich and the German People, that our Nation renounces (former claims in North Afrika)

It shall herewith be our policy to support French claims to this area, particularly Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Tripolitania, Fezzan, Cyrenaica, and the Sudan. We shall also back France in all areas of Afrika and Asia disputed between herself and the British Empire. French ships will be allowed free access to German Coaling stations throughout the world and in time of war,

France shall be permitted to dock, refuel, and reit in German and German controlled ports.

German military forces will be put at the disposal of France in the event of conflicting claims with other Powers.

(Esbjerg, Denmark) (from a press release by Graf von Bulow, Minister of War) The deployment of the British fleets has caused us, with the permission of the Kaiser and the Reichstag, to order the 2nd Imperial Fleet into the North Sea. They shall use force, if necessary, to gain this objective. Admiral Tirpitz and I agree that a fleet in position to menace London and Edinburgh shall nullify the English advantage of fleets being just off the coasts of Holland, Belgium, and Northwest Germany, and force them to reconsider their former aggressive and hostile actions.

We do not forget the possibility of being defeated. If forced back to Denmark, our policy will still be the same; we will and must be opposed in every way (we will not stop short of war) as long as England continues to menace our coasts. England is a far more experienced Sea Power than we, she has glorious traditions and high morale that comes with several centuries of success. Her men, leaders, and materielle are unparalleled and German may experience initial defeat. But we have double the resources of population. We have the superb harbours and rich trade of Flanders. We control the flow of Swedish steel and Baltic trade with our province of Denmark. I believe Germany would make a better ally than a foe.

We have word from the Emperor that there is still ample time to withdraw from Helgoland voluntarily and avert war. He tells us all military operations will stop in that event. He is willing to sign a non-aggression pact still. If England decides to continue her blatant aggressive acts I can only say this, "I and the officers and men under me, adhere strictly to the axiom of Clausewitz, "To introduce into the philosophy of war a principle of moderation would be an absurdity. War is an act of violence pushed to its utmost bounds!"

(Constantinople) The spiritual leader of the Moslem Community, Caliph Saalam Oleichem, today publicly prayed for world peace and entreated the leaders of other major faiths whose dedications had been belligerent to attempt a reconciliation between the two faiths, at least on the matter of world peace.

In a Positive response, His Holiness, Pope Benedictus VII, in Rome, has consented an audience to Ellen Phillip, economic advisor to the Moslem world. This will be an historic first. The first time that a non-catholic female has received an audience with his Holiness. In accepting the audience, she said, "I go to Rome in the earnest hope that by my presence a step towards peace is being taken. This first step is but the beginning of the journey and I humbly thank His Holiness for this opportunity to serve the cause of world peace."

May the Blessings of Allah be with you and the Turkish forces.

You may have your name placed on the priority lists without paying any game fees. Game fees do not become due until the game starts except for \$1.00 "additional games" under plan A. State your choice of country and game speed.

When a game list is published, each player will have two weeks to withdraw from that game list without losing his priority to play that country at that game-speed. The first time that a game list is published, it will be called a "Tentative Game List". Two issues later, it will be published again and called a "Final Game List". The game will start in the following issue except for the slow games which will start in the second issue following.

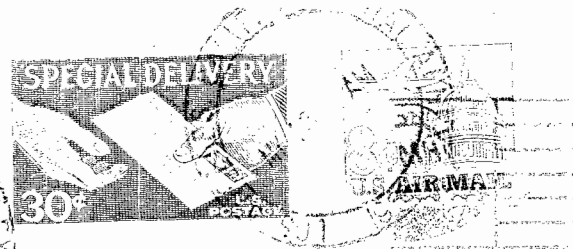
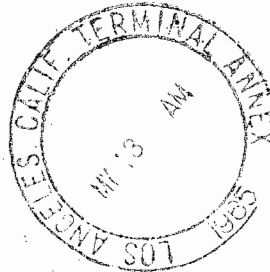
