

When we first started this publication, we said that we would not allow more than one player from each area in each game. Then, over-anxious to get games under way, (we were being heckled by a certain Eastern publisher) we started breaking rules of our own. We changed the limitation to two from each area and even fudged on that a bit. This caused what John Smythe refers to as "Geographical Alliances". This isn't usually an unfair alliance against the other players, it is more unfair to the two players from the same area who must ally because they find everyone else against them. There are many players in Los Angles who ally with each other simply to save the postage expense of corresponding with players elsewhere. Two such players were allied in Trantor for a while. But, there will be no more forced Geographical Alliances. There may be some players "from" the same area in a game. This cannot be helped but at the start of each game there will be 7 different areas represented.



1965 KN

(Paris) King Louis XXI has ordered elements of the Royal Army to Burgundy to suppress the revolt raging in that province sinde 1899. His Majesty has vowed to execute the ringleaders of the revola whom he claims are "agents of and supplied by a foreign power out to embarass France". The Fleet has been ordered to prevent supplies reaching the rebels through the neutral territories or Frence coastal provinces.

At the same time King Louis announced his intention to attend a conference of international order and peace in Berne. "France wants World Peace with Honor. We will not attack nor be a party to an attack except to protect France's just ambitions."

(Rome) Colonel Alphonse Capone, Public Relations Officer for His Imperial and Royal Majesty announced today that the peoples of Italy and their benevolent Emperor offer to make peace with all their neighbors - especially their wellarmed neighbors. The peaceful populace of the Italian Peninsula have renounced their famous warrior past and have embarked upon an era of peace and prosperity.

If the citizens of the many nations of Europe wish to have peace and thereby spare themselves the pain of war, all they must do is persuade their governments to accept the Pax Romana so sincerely offered by the peoples of Italy.

To the peoples of Europe, Italy offers her hand in peace. And, should any government insist upon being stubborn, the Italian peoples will send the necessary emissaries to "persuade" the errant government to be "reasonable"

(LONDON) Prime Minister, Dr. Marsupio von Ringo-Beatle announced that the beginning of the year would surely usher in a century of peace. ## Rules to be followed by the Gamesmaster

- 1. All of the original rules as published by Games Research, Inc. will be adhered to. (except for the choosing of countries by lot.)
- 2. A precedent set in a game will be followed throughout that game.
- 3. No conditional move will be accepted.
- 4. No joint moves will be accepted.
- 5. Any unit attempting to move may be Supported only to where it is going. If stood off it cannot be Supported in the province it is in.
- 6. This rule has been suspended and cancelled.
- 7. When a unit is successfully attacked from a province that it is attempting to move to, it still stands off any equally or less Supported unit that may be attempting to follow the successful attacker into that province.
- 8. No moves, retreats, or building of units will be done for any player by anyone other than that player. No retreats will be made automatically or conditionally. Even though there is no choice involved, a unit that is dislodged and not given a retreat order will be removed from the board.
- 9. Deadlines will not be postponed for any reason with the exception of the extra 5 days over Christmas.
- 10. When a player resigns, his units will hold or attempt to hold (and may be Supported for Holding by other players) for the remainder of the game. If someone wishes to replace another player, he must first receive the permission of the Gamesmaster and possibly pay a small fee, and then all of the other players in the game must agree to the replacement (in writing) before any moves will be put into the game from him.
- 11. The rule against the exchange of positions will be adhered to regardless of what fancy convoy maneuvers may be attempted to effect the exchange.

  (Please note that we are referring to the exchange of two units)
- 12. The decisions of the Gamesmaster and his Assistant are final.
- 13. A convoy move does not cut the Support against the fleet that is the last fleet to convoy the army in that "convoy-chain". When one of the fleets in the "convoy-chain" is dislodged, the attempted convoy does not cut any Support at all.
- 14. When two or more units are dislodged and ordered to retreat to the same place, they are both, or all, removed from the board.

to enter games, your choice of Plan A or Plan B:

- Plan A \$4.00 for the first game you are in and \$1.00 for each additional game. All games must be paid for on or before the Spring 1901 move of the first game you are in.
- Plan B No entrance fee but \$1.00 must be paid on or before the Spring move of each even-numbered game year untill \$8.00 has been paid. (Only \$5.00, if paid before Spring 1902.)


