1965 KJ (Berlin, DNE) Massive eruptions of a new and terribly virulent plague in Eastern Germany have forced mass evacuations of all cities east of the Berlin Munich line. Large groups of civilians and masses of military units are already seeking refuge in Holland, and negotiations are being conducted with the British for the possibility of ferrying large parts of the German people to the fertile English shores.

The plague, which seems to have originated in Western Poland, is as yet unnamed and unisolated. It produces at first a mild form of insanity, in which the victim becomes obsessed with the telling of meaningless "jokes" about the Polish people and their national characteristics, then rapidly produces a coma from which the victim never recovers.

Brilliant German toxicologist, Dr. Wolfram von Schultz, when questioned about the possibilities of isolating the plague germ and creating a serum, said yesterday, "Hah!" The Reichstag has adopted this as their official position.

## FRANCE BUILDS A NEW FLEET AT BREST!

(Berlin) Though the war clouds have boiled over Europe for three years, no nation is yet crushed and subjugated. Peace with honor is still possible. Therefore the German government invites all the nations of Europe to meet in Switzerland and attempt to redraw the boundaries of Europe on the principle of Self-Determination and freedom for all peoples. President Theodore Roosevelt will preside over the conference and has promised to bring his world famous big stick and the United States Fleet.

Regretfully, the recent accusations of England relating to supposed couriers washed ashore after a cease fire which Germany has yet to break suggests that the English are not truly peace-loving. Therefore they've not been invited. Englands interests will be represented by King Charles V, Charles Stuart, rightful king of England.

The mutual Polish-German treaty of Mutual Aid of 1899 together with all its provisions relating to military and economic support has been mutually abrogated.

President Ward has issued an official statement that "In this time of national emergency, it is every man for himself and the loser gets traded to the Mets!" This threat is expected to stiffen the resolve of German Army Commanders.

## Rules to be followed by the Gamesmaster

1. All of the original rules as published by Games Research, Inc. will be adhered to. (except for the choosing of countries by lot.)
2. A precedent set in a game will be followed throughout that game.
3. No conditional move will be accepted.
4. No joint moves will be accepted.
5. Any unit attempting to move may be Supported only to where it is going. If stood off it cannot be Supported in the province it is in.
6. This rule has been suspended and cancelled.
7. When a unit is successfully attacked from a province that it is attempting to move to, it still stands off any equally or less Supported unit that may be attempting to follow the successful attacker into that province.
8. No moves, retreats, or building of units will be done for any player by anyone other than that player. No retreats will be made automatically or conditionally. Even though there is no choice involved, a unit that is dislodged and not given a retreat order will be removed from the board.
9. Deadlines will not be postponed for any reason with the exception of the extra 5 days over Christmas.
10. When a player resigns, his units will hold or attempt to hold (and may be Supported for Holding by other players) for the remainder of the game. If someone wishes to replace another player, he must first receive the permission of the Gamesmaster and possibly pay a small fee, and then all of the other players in the game must agree to the replacement (in writing) before any moves will be put into the game from him.
11. The rule against the exchange of positions will be adhered to regardless of what fancy convoy maneuvers may be attempted to effect the exchange. (Please note that we are referring to the exchange of two units)
12. The decisions of the Gamesmaster and his Assistant are final.
13. A convoy move does not cut the Support against the fleet that is the last fleet to convoy the army in that "convoy-chain". When one of the fleets in the "convoy-chain" is dislodged, the attempted convoy does not cut any Support at all.
14. When two or more units are dislodged and ordered to retreat to the same place, they are both, or all, removed from the board.
