(Berlin) Emperor Harold Martinburg announced today that German will take a lone stand, refusing to ally with any country in the coming conflict. He went on to comment a great deal. "We have committed Germany to a policy of national self-interest in which she will not hoard territory but will reply to any violation of her borders, East as well as West!"

(Carthage) The Roman Senate, the Roman people, and the Roman Law have finally overcome the Sodom and Gomorrah of the Western Mediterranean. In a great victory for the Christian Empire of the Holy Emperors of Rome, the mighty legions of the aging Roman General and member of the Senate, Scipio Africanus, finally, after nearly 2,000 years of constant war, defeated the heathen hordes of the infamous despoilers of the Italian Peninsula, Hannibal Emperor and Autocrats of the City of Carthage.

(Vienna) Not knowing from which direction to expect attack or at least, treachery next, Emperor Franz Josef, in an effort to be at least open-handed about his treachery, today made known the attitude of his nation to the other major powers of Europe. Austria declares war on Russia, benenolent friendship on Turkey, suspicious non-aggression on Italy. Austria feels warmly friendly to Germany as long as she stays to the West or invades Russia, looks with interest on the French government, and does not recognize England at all. The Emperor noted that he declared war on Russia, not because she had invaded Galicia, but because she had ventured outside her own borders. ROME - The calm of the holiday season in the Eternal City was interrupted today by a stormy session of parliament. This special sitting had been called to ratify the King's recent act making the Marquis of Montferrat the effective dictator of the country. This action followed the sudden unexpected arrest of Foreign Minister Salami, Minister of War Bologna, and Minister of the Interior Provolone. Montferrat accused Salami, Bologna, and Provolone of being English agents on the rolls of Lord Sandwich.

The activities of these men is believed responsible for the failure of Italian arms in this year's campaigns. The rest of the cabinet was also dismissed. Montferrat revealed that Minister of Justice Voltore is keeping three mistresses in Florence, Minister of Posts Largo has routed secret communications into Austrian hands, Minister of Marine Balena was party to a plot to provoke an Italian war against France, and Minister of the Treasury Lazzarone is guilty of counterfeiting with government printing presses.

ROME The Italian Parliament cheered Prime Minister Montferrat's speech to the emergency session, and hissed vigorously when he mentioned the names and crimes of the ousted cabinet members. The assembled legislators were particularly enthusiastic over his attack on Austria-Hungary. Ever since the wars of the Risorgimento, Austria has been unpopular here, and the Treaty of 1901 was accepted only grudgingly in the face of the Turkish threat to the peace of the Mediterranean.

"And now have the Austrians lived up to their agreement?" the Marquis of Montferrat asked. "I cite Article II of the treaty. The primary objective of the High Contracting Powers shall be the destruction of the Ottoman Empire and the liberation of the Balkans. - Yet today, we see the disgraceful spectacle of the Austro-Hungarian Empire deserting Christian Europe to make an alliance with the Turk. Furthermore, Article III of this Treaty placed Greece in the Italian sphere of influence. But Austro-Hungarian duplicity has continually thwarted Italian armed forces in their attempts to establish themselves in Greece. We have been lead to make unjustified and unnecessary forays into the Western Mediterranean while the treacherous Austrian moves his forces into the Tyrolian Alps! Even now, fellow Italians, an Austrian army is quartered in Trintino - a town which, by all rights of history and culture, is Italian!!"

At these words the Irredentist Party benches cheered the Prime Minister as they had not since the beginning of the war. The Irredentist Leader, Count Diocleziani, led the applause with cries of Italia Irredentia

(continued from page 5) "Enough of wayward policies and aimless troop movements," Montferrat continued. "From now on, Italy will return to the glories of her Roman past. The new War Cabinet for National Unity will, while prosecuting the war to a victorious conclusion, work to revive the spirit in which Rome built an empire. I have the humble honor to claim descent from the Caesars, and will follow in their footsteps until the Mediterranean is once more our Sea."

Vatican City In a Christmas day message to the world, Pope Sylvester IV broke with centuries of precedent by announcing firm papal support for the war aims of the Kingdom of Italy. "The rupture between the Holy See and the Kingdom of Italy is ended," he told a cheering throng in St. Peter's Square.

"We are once more in accord on issues of world policy - including the punishment of those oath-breakers and traitors to Christendom who now rule the Austro-Hungarian Empire. A papal blessing lies on the arms of the Kingdom of Italy. Our curse lies on those traitors to God and man who govern Austria."

After the Pope's speech, a source high in the Curia indignantly denied the rumour that His Holiness is the illegitimate half-brother of the Marquis of Montferrat. "Nor is it true, as Austrian agents have rumoured," said Cardinal Anheuser-Busch, "that Pope Sylvester's election last summer is due to the influence of the Prime Minister. The Prime Minister of Italy, powerful though he is, cannot, by his mere influence, name the Pope. I'll have you know that his election cost us a good three million lire!! Influence, indeed!"

Rome The New Year's Honors List of King Umberto I was headed today by the name of Claudio Constantino Paleogo, formerly Marquis and now Duke of Montferrat. The royal citation praised Montferrat's many services to the Crown, beginning with the detection of an assassination plot five years ago, and culminating in the recent cabinet crisis.

Rome The Duke of Montferrat announced today that the present Parliament will not be continued in office. "Instead, we will continue to reconstruct Rome after the ancient model. From now on, the laws of Italy will be made by a Senate which I shall appoint."

The Prime Minister then went on to deal with the anticipated protests that such a form of government would be undemocratic. "Such claims are preposterous. The essence of democratic government is responsibility. The new Senate will be responsible to me. I will be responsible to it. Responsibility will thus be complete!"

In accordance with the re-establishment of the Roman Senate in the ancient tradition, Montferrat announced that henceforth Italian armies will carry into battle; standards inscribed "SPQR".

FRENCH ?"SKILL"? AGAIN TAKES MUNICH!

1965 KJ (Berlin) Kaiser Wilhelm today publicly thanked the noble armies of the French Republic for their offer to send aid to the plague ridden provinces of Germany but politely declined to endanger the lives of the brave French citizenry. He stressed the danger to all of France, should the French army enter Munich. "In a time," the Kaiser continued, "when France faces inevitable war of long duration with the Italian nationlists, she can ill afford to spare us an army that would probably never leave Germany alive."

Dr. Wolfram von Schultz, former National Minister of Health, yesterday gave his life in the battle against the terrible plague spreading throughout our land. Experts are still uncertain as to whether or not von Schultz had contacted the plague, but when he voiced an unspeakably banal joke at yesterday's session of the Council of Ministers; Security Chief Simon Templar had him shot out of hand and the body burned to prevent contagion.

## Rules to be followed by the Gamesmaster

1. All of the original rules as published by Games Research, Inc. will be adhered to. (except for the choosing of countries by lot.)
2. A precedent set in a game will be followed throughout that game.
3. No conditional move will be accepted.
4. No joint moves will be accepted.
5. Any unit attempting to move may be Supported only to where it is going. If stood off it cannot be Supported in the province it is in.
6. This rule has been suspended and cancelled.
7. When a unit is successfully attacked from a province that it is attempting to move to, it still stands off any equally or less Supported unit that may be attempting to follow the successful attacker into that province.
8. No moves, retreats, or building of units will be done for any player by anyone other than that player. No retreats will be made automatically or conditionally. Even though there is no choice involved, a unit that is dislodged and not given a retreat order will be removed from the board.
9. Deadlines will not be postponed for any reason with the exception of the extra 5 days over Christmas.
10. When a player resigns, his units will hold or attempt to hold (and may be Supported for Holding by other players) for the remainder of the game. If someone wishes to replace another player, he must first receive the permission of the Gamesmaster and possibly pay a small fee, and then all of the other players in the game must agree to the replacement (in writing) before any moves will be put into the game from him.
11. The rule against the exchange of positions will be adhered to regardless of what fancy convoy maneuvers may be attempted to effect the exchange. (Please note that we are referring to the exchange of two units)
12. The decisions of the Gamesmaster and his Assistant are final.
13. A convoy move does not cut the Support against the fleet that is the last fleet to convoy the army in that "convoy-chain". When one of the fleets in the "convoy-chain" is dislodged, the attempted convoy does not cut any Support at all.
14. When two or more units are dislodged and ordered to retreat to the same place, they are both, or all, removed from the board.

Plan A \$4.00 for the first game you are in and \$1.00 for each additional game. All games must be paid for on or before the Spring 1901 move of the first game you are in.

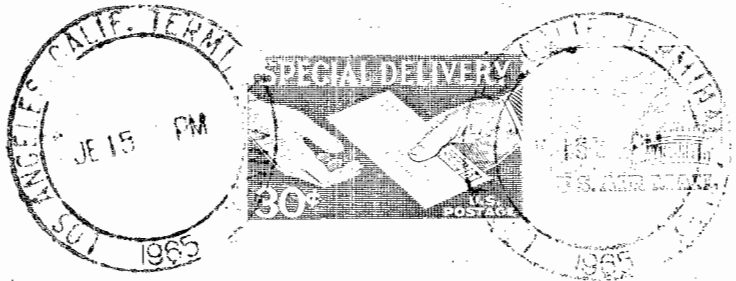
