1965 KQ

(Vienna) As a result of the increased need for national unity in this time of national crisis, the Dual Monarchy is hereby dissolved. The Magyar realm is hereby restored to the full domination of the Hapsburg Throne. - Franz Joseph.

(Jena) The Imperial German Government, the only Spanish-speaking nation in the European Big 7, hereby declares 'confused non-aggression' upon France. At the same time it was disclosed that 'no chances will be taken' allowing the French infantry, which is of unprecedented might, to sneak through the border fortifications.

The Jena government (the capital moves from year to year as the Emperor changes his shallow mind often) also warned both England and Russia that anti-German manoeuvres will be met by support of all of the evil country's enemies, especially in Scandinavia. 'Naturally we don't expect any problems,' said the Minister for Sneers and Military Bombasticism, Miguel Sanchez de Desperdicios. 'Both nations have assured us of their kindly intentions, and only inherent badness in them would cause a rupture of relations. We trust them so far, even, that we are willing to move our forces away from their perimeter.'

Spring 1903

1935 KN

(Paris) King Louis XXI today proclaimed the union of France and England with the final subjection of the English rebels who today surrendered at Liverpool. The new Kingdom will be ruled by the childless Louis but King John of England has been named heir to the joint throne. In the first meeting of the new Anglo-French Parliament the English delegates, incensed by Italian recognition of Edward VI's now discredited government demanded a declaration of war on Italy; but cooler French heads, all too aware of the Italian Mediterranean Squadrons, prevailed and adopted a substitute resolution urging the King to take all actions necessary to preserve the independence and autonomy of the French nation. A small minority demanded an alliance with Italy and War on Austria. These delegates found their main strength in Marseilles and Spain.

(Rome) The Senate ratified today a treaty with the Germanic tribes now inhabiting the lands along the North Sea. The signatories were the Belgae, Jutes, Angles, Saxons and the arch-enemies of Odius Oedipus, the Laius. Bitterly opposed to the treaty was Six-penicus, leader of the Do-Nothings. The Senate Majority Leader pleaded, "How can we sign treaties with a people who do not have a government? We have refused the honorable requests of the Albions. How can we honor the requests of of some barbarian tribes who live on the western shores of some distant sea."

The only response to the speech was the splintering of the clay tablet as it was broken over Six-penicus' bald pate. So outraged were the Senators at the speech that they stormed to the podium and commenced to break into little pieces the clay tablets upon which the speech was written. So it would seem to this observer that the war fever has split the Do-Nothings. The Bakers have joined with the Imperium to put an end to the expansion of the Gallic Tribes.

(Naples) The mighty fleets of Senatorial Rome are being readied. Thousands of laborers and mountains of supplies and equipment are pouring into the principal naval port of Rome. Unofficial sources report that the Senate has commissioned Admiral Aqua to outfit a great armada to sail to the North Sea and there give succor to the

allies of Rome. The armada is reputed to be comprised of no less than 500 galleys. Of this total 173 vessels will be triremes. So great is the demand upon the economy of Rome that all Italians will be forced to give up pizza for a week. The cost of the war continues to mount.
