Fall 1904 1965KX

(Rome) The Senate and People of Rome today proclaimed a state of armed neutrality with respect to the current conflict between Germany and Austria-Hungary. The Senate, after angry charges that the Hapsburg threat was being unduly neglected, voted by a narrow margin to ratify the Treaty of Mantua ending hostilities with Austria. Ministers for the Government were threatened with impeachment by the Cato faction, strongly supported by Senators representing the Duke and Council of Venice, when it was announced that the Treaty had been signed. In Naples and Sicily, the news that hostilities in the North were ended was greeted with undisguised joy, and the fishing fleets of Apulia and Campagnia, long confined to port by the threat of Austrian domination of the Ionian Sea, once more resumed their activities. The Cato faction held a press conference following the historic session, and announced that although they had reluctantly withdrawn the charges of treason against the government, they were still unconvinced that the war was over. In order to gaurd against any possibility of incident which might renew hostilities, the garrison of Venice was transferred to Piedmont, and regiments raised in Rome were dispatched to Venice. The government pointed out that Venice was fully protected, and that the Navy was more than competent to patrol the seas dominating the Italian Overseas Empire.

(Brest) At the request of the Count of Normandy, Roman marines stormed ashore and forcibly disbanded the British Royal Fusiliers who had proclaimed a Restored Stuart Monarchy in Northwestern France. The petition for annexation of the whole of the former French territories to the New Roman Empire was received, and the action of Admiral Plinius in granting the request was approved by the Senate of Rome. Proclamation by the Pope was expected immediately, and it is known that five new Bishops were named by the Holy Office for the Bishoprics in and around Brittany.

(Rome) Italy is looking for an ally! Any ally! First telephone call probably wins: (no collect calls, please.) Area code 814 phone# 226-7205. Thank you.

(Bora-Bora, The Imperial Province Of Oceana) Baron Munchhausen announced here today. " The German Monarchy still reigns, but only here in the Pacific, where the whole German Army has fled from the hordes of Italians which overran most of German Austria."

(Palace of the Golden Horn) The Great Council of State of the Othmanli Empire of the Faithful announced today that negotiations with the Italian Monarchy have apparently succeeded in persuading the King. Senate, and People of Rome that their interest does not lie in war with the Great Alliance of the Othmanli and Hapsburg Dynasties. The Italians are expected to withdraw their Fleet from the Aegean Sea, and to cease hostilities toward Austrian territory in the North. Sources within the Palace also confided to reporters that the Vizier has requested that Austria-Hungary also conclude peace terms with Italy upon conditions that Italians withdraw to the West. To date, there has been no answer from Munchhausen, the Austrian Chancellor and Commander of Forces, and it is understood that the Aulic Council of the Austro-Hungarian Empire is considering the matter.

Highly place Turkish officials were difficult to reach, and it is rumoured that they were conducting negotiantions with the British Empire. Massive reinforcements have been sent to the Jannissaries now located in Armenia, and all signs point to renewed efforts to take Sevastopol. The Turkish Ministry of War is also known to have sent three trainloads of ammunition and other military supplies to the Austrian army in Greece, and it is believed that this was required in order that the Austro-Hungarian Fleet could conduct operations against the Italian attempt to seize control of the vital Ionian Sea.

It is understood that an ultimatum has been delivered to Italy with great reluctance, and that war with Italy is a real possibility unless the Italian forces in the Aegean and Bohemia are withdrawn or eliminated.

1965KM

(Berlin) The Imperial Diet today approved the new Chancellor von R. Hindenberg and his Cabinet, ending the longest constitutional crisis in recent German history. The Socialist Deputies, obviously motivated by concern over foreign affairs, agreed to postpone for the duration their demands for complete nationalization of the steel industries, and the shippards at Kiel were finally able to complete construction fo a new Fleet consisting of five Dreadnought-type battleships with primary armament of 9 fifteen inch guns, as well as numerous auxiallary craft.

In response to urgent requests from the Ministers for the Queen, Kaiser Wilhelm ordered German marines to seize control of Cornwall and Wales and end the Liberal-Labor seccionist regime which had defied the edicts of the Royal Government in London. His Imperial Majesty is known to be deeply concerned about the reports of the poor health of his Grandmother, Queen Victoria, and although there was sharp criticism from the Imperial Diet, the Cabinet was persuaded to ratify his decision. Under the Constitution, the Fleets are directly at the command of the Kaiser, although appropriations for their construction must be approved by the Diet. It is rumoured that the Communist government of Liverpool has been handed an ultimatum by Admiral Radenstern, and that German marines may soon land if it does not submit to Victoria.

Approval of the new Government was sharply conditioned upon the promise of the new Cabinet to do all within their power to end the war with France and normalize relationships with the French nation. In a suprise move, the Army of Burgundy was ordered to withdraw to German territory, and German forces were shifted to provide a more flexible and complete defense of the Empire. An army was also dispatched to Tyrolia, presumably to guard against any suprise attack by Italian forces. There was no information concerning the future plans fo the Government regarding the State of Italy.

The Reichs-Chancellor announced a renewal of the only treaty of which a true copy could be found. It is understood that an urgent request has been directed toward all governments which have not yet sent representatives to Berlin, in an attempt to discover what treaties and agreements might still be in force. After the unpleasant circumstances surrounding the fall of the previous government, including the complete destruction by fire cf the Imperial Archives, no official was certain of the status of relations with other nations.
