

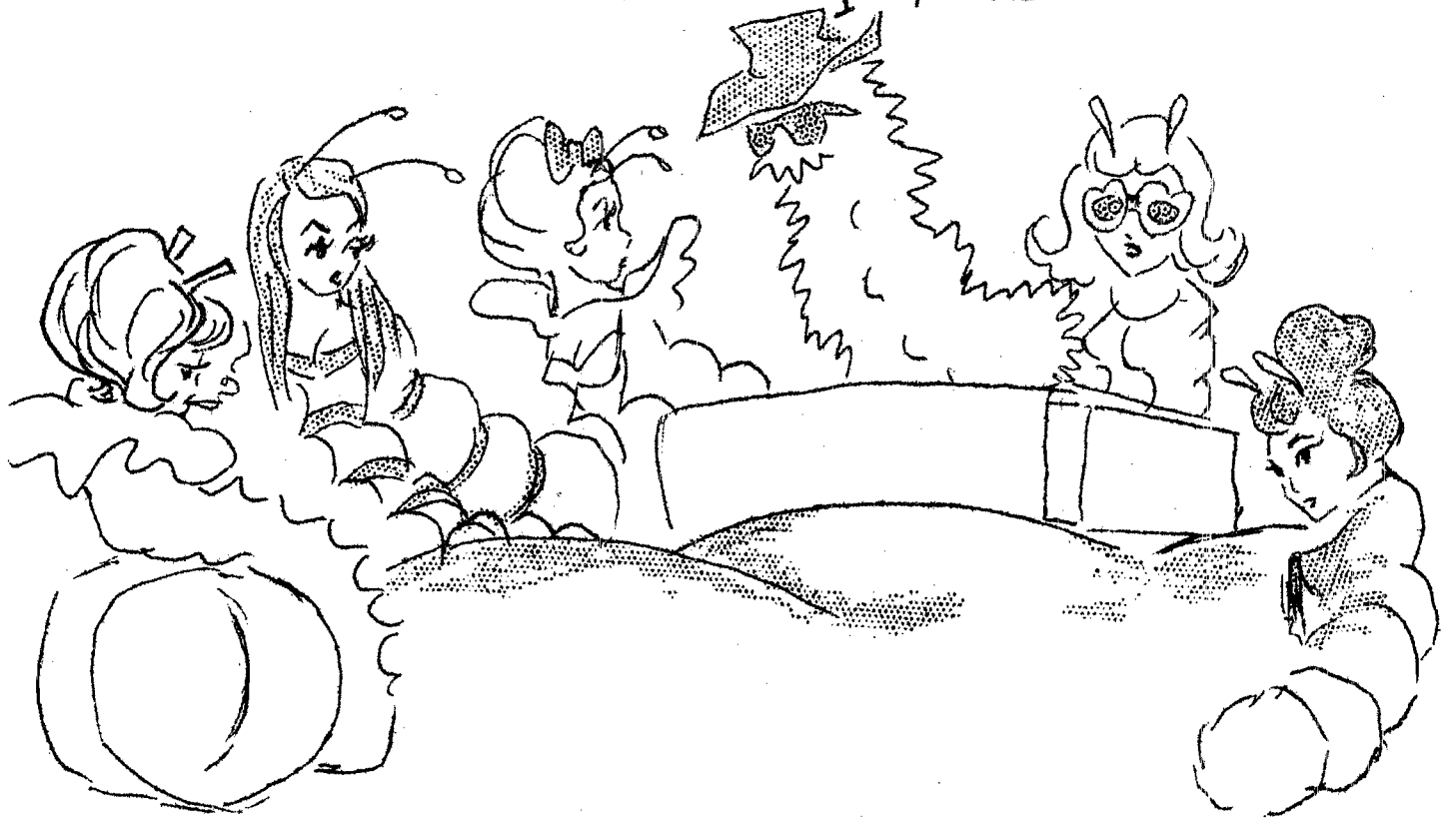

1966KL

(Rome) Tribune Romulus Reagani today seized the Capitoline Palace and Proclaimed himself Emperor of all the Roman Empire. With the support of the 2nd Legion, he was able to defeat the Praetorian Guard and take the Holy City. He immediately announced the disembarkation of the 1st Fleet to reclaim Utica from the rebels. He also announced that troops would be dispatched to aid Governor Pontius Pilatus in recapturing Muaretania, Numidia, and Curenica from rebel bands of Parthians. At the Forum, he pledged efforts in reclaiming the eastern areas of the Empire. A representative of the Goths met with Romulus Reagani, himself a native of Raetia and confirmed that the Emperor had renounced Roman claims in Gaul.

(Paris) The sudden death of King Louis XXI has left the Anglo-French Empire in a state of confusion. It is widely remembered that John II while he was Foreign Minister for Louis XXI, negotiated both the Italian and Austrian treaties. While English delegates largely selected by John II do favor war with Italy, his delegates in Normandy voted in favor the resolution urging an alliance with Italy. There is little doubt that recent troop movements have brought the two countries to the very brink of war. Yet, it is to be noted that the English units of the Empire have not been ordered to the front. Sir Malcolm Wellesley Farnsworth-Hale, confidant of John II, and known member of the pro-Italian Alliance faction has been named Foreign Minister and sent to Rome. However, this is somewhat offset by the appointment of Pro-Austrian Comte Rupert de Savignon to the Ministry of Defense. The Cabinet is fairly evenly balanced between the two factions with the odd position being held by the Minister of Science and Technology, Charles de Belgae, who favors war with both, "to restore the Grandeur that was France!"

John II has called a press conference for tomorrow to give his viewpoint of the war. No one knows what he will say but informed guesses say that whomever offers the best deal will buy French Support.

(Rome) The split in the Do-Nothings appears to be healed. Yesterday, the Bakers joined forces with the Candlestick Makers to form a solid front against the Imperium. The turning point was the Odius Oedipus's offer of a just and honorable peace treaty. For when their war chief, Ward The Terrible, proved his worthiness by attacking the barbarian Viennesse, the coalition demanding war with the Gallic tribes collapsed. The new Dictator of Rome during the emergency will be none other than Six-penicus, the courageous prophet and inspired statesman of the Do-Nothings.

(Byzantium) The legions of Maximus Maximus and Scipio have launched a joint invasion of the lands of the terrible tribes of the State of the Scythians and Sarmatians. In answer to the urgent cry of assistance by the Greek mercenaries hired by the Viennese, the two Roman Generals ordered their troops to capture the cities of Phanagoria, Panticapaeum, and Chersonesus. Olbia already cleansed by Ajax's hoplites was not ordered secured. It is thought that with these cities as forward bases, the final occupation of the steppes will not take long.

England, Russia, and Turkey are out of the game already and still no one has invaded Denmark. Wild 'n Wooly has the strangest games going. This may be caused by our having the strangest Gamesmaster going.

In our Panic to put in replacement players last month, we neglected to record who was going to replace who in which games. We became confused and decided to wait for the players to straighten us out, as usual. We put a new player for Germany into this game without ever telling Austria-Hungary about it.

Consequently, the sudden mobilization of the Germans was a great surprise to the Austrian forces. Such things are some of the growing pains of Postal Diplomacy.

"As to 1965KN, I am half tempted to not approve of McCallum, or anyone else, taking over Germany, since it becomes much more easy for me to win without a German-French alliance to face as well as Smythe in Italy. However, it also makes the game quite unfair to have no Germany, and it takes some of the enjoyment out of the whole thing. Yes, I approve of McCallum (as one must of such Good Men), and, moreover, make such approval retroactive to Fall 1904.
