(Vienna) Crown Prince Hapsburg has ordered all units to the outermost borders of the Empire to prepare for any eventuality. However, no troops are outside our borders except for Sevastopol where they are stationed at the request of the Governor to prevent civil collapse in the absence of effective Russian Government, and Venice where the northern defenses of Italy have been assumed per Italian request. Rumours in the Capitol speak of war with Germany if the German forces are not removed from Bohemia. Only the notorious instability of the previous German government has avoided war thus far. Some clash with France is expected in northern Italy. With the dramatic turn of fortunes in the last year or so; the Austrian people face these threats with confidence.

RUMOURS OF WAR

Spring 1905

(Paris) With the failure of the Austrians to apologize for their attack on Munich and their failure to explain the violations of the Austro-French treaty of friendship; John II went before Parliment to ask for a Declaration of War against Austria-Hungary. The presence of a regiment of troops in Paris seemed to have a salutary effect, as the deputies voted John II absolute authority for the duration, as well as his Declaration of War by 212-99. The vote was expected to be much closer as a non government resolution urging war had received only 152 votes just last month. John II immediately announced that while tactical considerations demanded that France remain on the defensive for the present, at least one more theatre would commence offensive operations at once. No major reshuffling of command is anticipated.

(Rome) The Six-Penicus Government, against its wishes, has been forced to declare war against the barbarian empire of Ward the Terrible. The spokesman for the government stated that the building of additional naval units by the Odius Oedipus could be interpreted only as an act of aggression. Therefore, the naval squadrons of Admiral Aqua have been ordered to secure the Iberian Peninsula. Also the 5th Armada has been ordered to reinforce the Admiral's

(Turino) In conjunction with the attack on the Odius Oedipus' positions in Spain, the Legions of Magnus Soldat commenced the invasion of Transalpine Gaul. It is expected that the important Military Depot of Marseilles will be taken by storm in the early fall.

(Rome) The Six-Penicus Government was questioned about their relations with the barbarian Viennesse. The Majority Leader's response was, "We aren't at war with the Viennesse, but neither are we at peace. The only way that I can explain our relations with them is to say that we are participating in Peaceful Aggression with the Viennesse."

(Rome) Count Garlic 'n Pizza was heard to say that the Italian Government was very upset over the recent articles in the "neutralist pamphlet" Wild 'n Wooly. ((thats us)) The good Count hinted that the Imperial Government would take steps to insure the cessation of the articles. ((Like Sawiczewski, he is declaring war on us. We'll have to Garrisson St. Paul, as well as Denver and Portland.))

(Torino) The government has initiated an ambitious program of strengthening the military garrissons along the Swiss border. ((Swiss border?? I thought I was in the North woods! I'm lost again!)) REPLACEMENT PLAYERS: The usual fee for a replacement player is \$1.00 but this is not always true. Replacement players are subject to approval by the Gamesmaster and the players.
