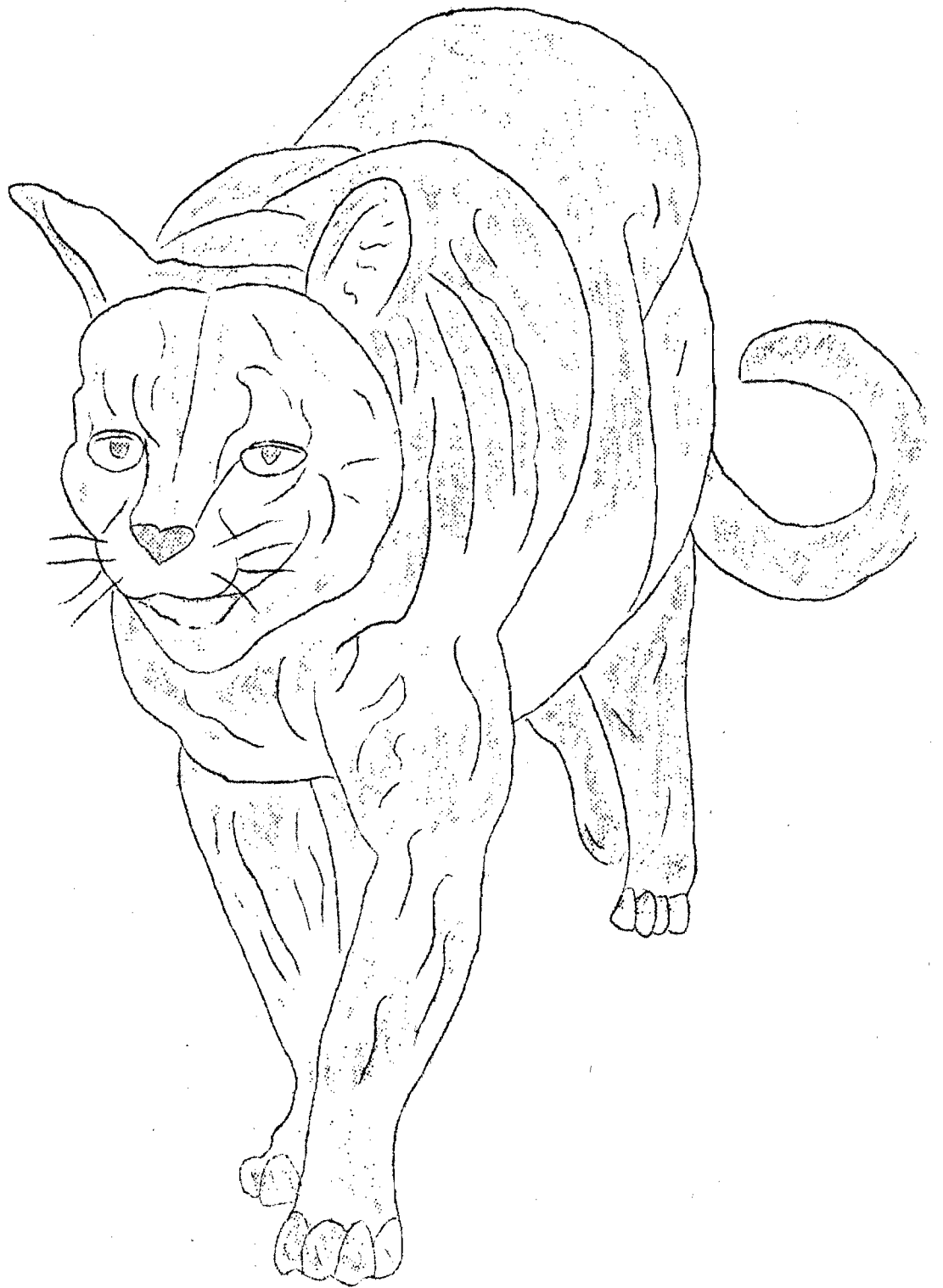

1965KX

(Rome) The Senate today unanimously declared that due to an unprovoked attack by Germany on the province of Burgundy, recently incorporated into the Empire, a state of war now exists between the Senate and People of Rome and His Imperial Majesty, Kaiser of Germany. A junior Centurian, last surviving officer of the tiny garrison force which had been stationed in Burgundy, declared that there was, and had been no, provocation, and that pursuant to the agreement between the Senate and the German Empire, only Military police forces were present when German calvary and infantry troops crossed the border.

Centurian Junius Claudius Alba, descended from the ancient Claudian family, escaped capture through the efforts of the Bishop of Lorraine. The Protestant Armies of Germany apparently busied themselves with desecrating the Bishop's Chancery, thus enabling Centurian Claudius and a small detachment of Military Police, together with His Excellency the Bishop and his Chancery staff, to escape in a peasant's wagon. The attack by German forces stunned the population of Burgundy, and although there had previously been opposition to the incorporation of France into the Roman Empire, this seems to have vanished in the wake of the menace of the "Boche".

The Cato faction in the Senate, which previously had opposed the treaty of peace between the Roman Empire and the Holy Roman Empire of Austria-Hungary, also approved, unread, a treaty of Alliance which Ministers of the Government said they would submit to His Imperial Majesty in Vienna. The Austrian Chancery is said to be studying the proposed agreement, and the Papal Nuncio in Vienna is said to have reported to His Holiness that there will be no difficulty in cementing a permanent Treaty of Friendship and Alliance between the two Roman Empires.

(Rome) Reinselini said, "Italy today signed an Alliance with Russia, against Turkey, and the Sweet Potato crop in Galicia was rotten!"

(Vienna) Assistant Censor Fritz-Bock was arrested today for showing entirely too much zeal on his job. His announced intention of "rooting treasonous words and ideas from the very bosom of the Empire" was generally applauded until it was discovered that he was actually altering the books of the Imperial Budget.

Baron Munchauszen announced that, "Negotiations having failed miserably with the Czar, it is necessary to act in support of the loyal Turks." He also commented, "I sure hope that I won't have to eat my words about the good Ottoman."

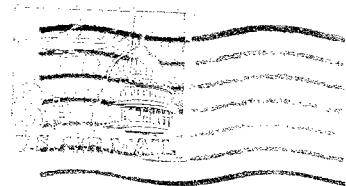
WESTERCON the 19th! The West Coast Science Fiction Convention will meet in the month of July on July 1 thru 4, inclusive.
