

(Rome) Her Royal Majesty, Queen E. Barbara Phillip, spoke to her people from St. Peter's Basilica.

"It is a particularly sad duty which causes me to come

before you, My People, today. There is a clear and present danger to our national and to world peace that is manifesting itself in the form of an Arms Race on this continent.

Too many of you people spend thousands of dollars on the Tele-phone Company. A local "friend" of mine came up with an easy way to send a limited message by telephone without spending any money. Best of all, each two players can have their own personal code. List all of the provinces and sea areas in some sort of order and match them up to the names on your N3F roster (after eliminating those people with duplicate first or last names). The person's first name will be used for where the unit is and their last name will indicate where it is going to. Then call person to person, asking for this composite name at your ally's phone number. He'll refuse the call, saving any charges, and still know the move.
