(Rome) The Senate today unanimously accepted the petition of the friends of Stephen II, Roman Catholic heir to the dominions of the Stuarts, and ordered the Italian forces now keeping order in the British Isles to do whatever would be necessary to restore the rightful King to the throne of his ancestors. During the minority of the King; P. Scipio Drusus Britannicus Claudius will act as Lord Protector of England and Grand High Admiral of The Fleets Of The Northern Waters.

Spokesman for the Holy Office also announced that His Holiness had approved the restoration of the Stuarts, and that either II Papa or a very highly placed representative would officiate at the Coronation upon the King's majority.

In other actions by the Senate, the Third Legion was awarded the Order of the True Cross for its prompt recovery of the Province of Burgundy so treacherously seized by the Germans. The Cato faction also announced that, due to the extraordinary good faith shown by the Austro-Hungarian Empire, it withdrew all objections to the Treaty with His Imperial Highness and Majesty. The Cato faction has dwindled in importance in recent months because a great many of their number have taken commissions with the forces overseas in what they call the "Holy War" against Germany.

Cincinnatus made a rare personal appearance at the Senate and announced that the Government sends its regrets to the Austrians over their loss of Munich; he pledged that Roman forces will soon act with the heroic Austrians to restore Munich and Bavaria to Austrian control. A map, showing trans-Rhenian Germany as a part of a restored Austrian Empire, was circulated and approved by the Senate. When questioned about the Russian attempts to enter the Norwegian Sea; II Dictator pointed out that, not only was the Russian probe unsuccessful, but that under no circumstances could it ever be successful - - "even," he said, "if the Russians make the drastic error of combining with the Germans. We have too many fleets, and the British North Sea Fleet is loyal to the restored Dynasty. No, we shall not find ourselves at war with the Russians over such a trivial matter as that."

Baron Munchhausen, speaking from the steps of the Imperial Laughing
Academie, today explained the recent army manuevres on the plains of Warsaw.
"Look", he said, "this is a dual monarchy. It is therefore only appropriate
that we pick on dual Great Powers when we go to war."

(Constantinople) In a suprise action, the Vizier has ordered a renewal of
the attack on Sevastopol, risking the capture of the Capital itself. The
Government has already moved the Sultan and his family to a place of refuge,
and the archives have also been removed from Constantinople. The Vizier
said, "that although the war with Italy will be pursued to the final and
complete destruction of the Italians, our alliance is paramount in all
considerations. By attacking the Russians, we make it easier for our Austrian
allies to take Warsaw. Once Sevastopol falls, we will be able to deal with
the Italians at our leisure. One fleet constitutes no particular threat to
our Empire but while Russia remains strong, there is no knowing what they
may do to the balance of power in Europe. Long Live the Alliance!"
