

(Vienna) WAR DECLARED ON ITALY: At a press conference in the National Palace this morning, her Fletcher, himister of Public Informantion and Spokesman of Crown Prinz Engen, explained the circumstances behind the declaration: "Basically, this action is dictated by an integral part of our National Self-Interest: Expansion into Italy is necessary to gain unhindered access to the Mediterranean. At least we're not going to be hypocrites about our actions . . besides, we must protect the spawning rights of the Slavic-speaking fish of the Adriatic Sea.

1965KY

(Vienna) Austrian units on the southeastern front, inactive for two long years now started their Spring Offensive with a series of attacks on frontier positions in Armenia and the Ukraina. Brushing aside lightly armed frontier posts, the Hen of Austria advanced thirty miles inland on the opening day of the campaign and seized the provinces with moderate fighting. The Turkish government, which has always had trouble keeping order in Armenia, filed a pro forma protest, but no military action appeared likely. No further actions against Turkey are contemplated until a pacification campaign controls Armenia. The Ukrainian natives welcomed the Austrians but appeared frightened and ill at ease. Some sort of an Austro-English link up that would liberate Moscow and Warsaw was not considered unlikely.
