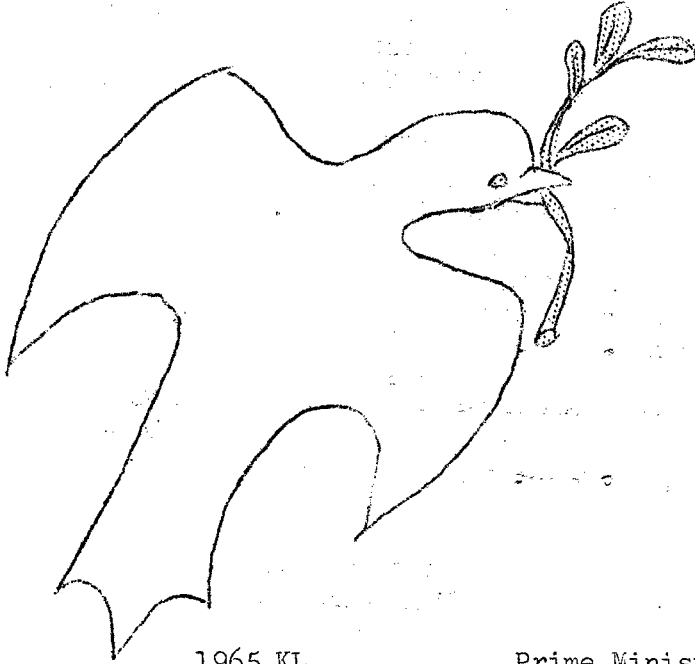

PEACE SECURED IN THE BALKANS

SEVEN MAJOR POWERS OF EUROPE
FORM A GRAND ALLIANCE TO
ENSURE WORLD PEACE

FEAST IN VIENNA

1965 KL Prime Minister Hornswoggle P. Schmidt-Nagy of Hungary announced at a press conference today that he would be an official of the 10 day feast to be held in Vienna to celebrate the forming of the League of Nations. Sultan Abd-Al-Amid will be the guest of honor. He will speak of his unusual methods for securing the peace in the Balkans. Many royal families of Europe will be present. The U. S. will not be represented. They have apparently no interest in becoming involved in European affairs.

(Warsaw, 3, Jan.) The Empire of Poland and Kingdom of Muscovy, whose great interest has long been the preservation of peace and the manifestation of friendship among the great states of Europe, declares that from this day forth NO MILITARY FORCE shall be used by this nation except for the preservation of internal order, and except insofar as shall become necessary to guarantee the freedom and integrity of the Polish and Russian peoples, and except as shall be necessary to maintain peace in Europe. We further call upon all states to declare openly the same intentions, in an effort to maintain an atmosphere of mutual respect and understanding and to preserve peace in the world.

We strongly encourage overtures of friendship from any and all nations, and are particularly gratified to make public a treaty of Co-operation between the Kingdoms of Poland and Muscovy, and the Sovereign Kingdom of Roumania; the text of which is available to any interested party from the Foreign Ministry. We openly declare our support of any nation of peaceful intent and action, and wish all our glorious European neighbours the greatest prosperity in the new century.

(London, 4, Jan.) Queen Victoria, although gravely ill, urged parliament to try to maintain peace in Europe. The Queen was assisted by Prince Charles, who has taken personal command of all English forces.

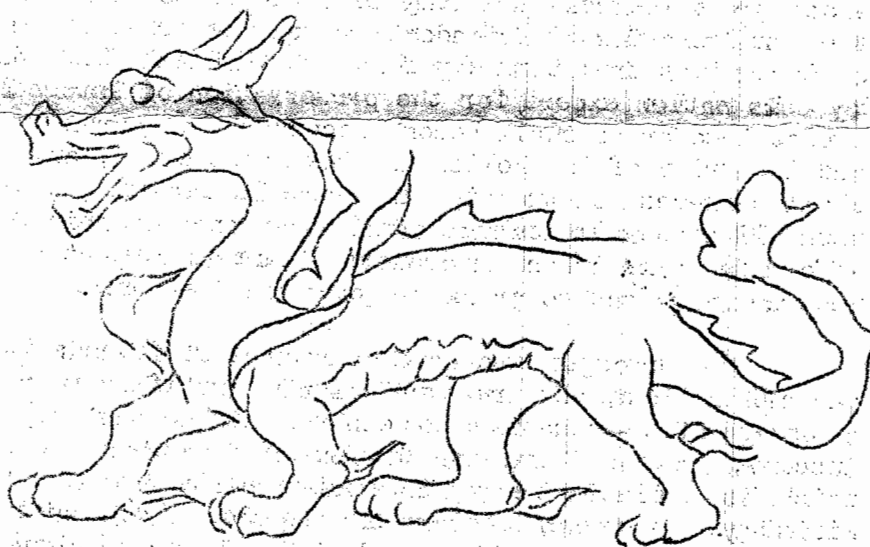
Because Parliament fears that England may be cut off from food supplies from the continent; rationing laws have been passed. The Defense Ministry is now setting up rationing centers in London.

Rumours in London have it that Germany has threatened to walk out of the League of Nations if assessments are increased to finance a "Statue of Liberty" being built in France.

(Copenhagen) Five men were arrested yesterday and were accused of being spies for "a foreign power". Officials here declined to give the nationality of the arrested men. Meanwhile, the government is temporarily in recess because of the flood.

A spokesman stated that a six inch rise in the water level would be disastrous. The army reserves were called up to fill sandbags in an effort to reinforce the dikes.

The Red Cross is rushing supplies to the stricken area as it appears that the flood cannot be contained. However the damage and loss of life can be minimized by quick action.



Rules to be followed by the Gamesmaster

A free game will be awarded to the player against whom an error is made by the gamesmaster either in the application of the Diplomacy rules or in the application of precedents.

1. All of the original rules as published by Games Research, Inc. will be adhered to. (except for the choosing of countries by lot.)
2. A precedent set in a game will be followed throughout that game.
3. No conditional move will be accepted.
4. No joint moves will be accepted. (This means that moves from any two players if mailed together should be sealed in separate envdlops.)
5. Any unit attempting to move may be supported only to where it is going. If stood off it cannot be supported in the province it is in.
6. A unit attacked with more force than it has supporting it must retreat even though the attacking force is stood off by another attacking force. (This leaves the disputed area unoccupied.)
7. When a unit is successfully attacked from a given province that it is attempting to move to it still stands off any equally supported or less supported unit attempting to follow into that given province.
8. No moves, retreats, or building of units will be done for any player by the Gamesmaster and no retreats will be made automatically or conditionally. Even though there is no choice involved any unit which is dislodged and not given a retreat order will be removed from the play.
9. Deadlines will not be postponed for any reason with the one exception of the extra five days over Christmas. Please note that the deadlines published are postmark deadlines and not receipt deadlines. Local players must hand in their moves on the deadline date or mail them. Moves sent in by night letter must be dated for the deadline date or sooner.
10. When someone resigns from a game, his units all hold for the duration of the game. If a player wishes to replace another player, he must first receive permission from the Gamesmaster and possibly pay a small fee, and then all of the other players still in the game must agree to the replacement before any moves will be accepted from him.
11. The rule against the exchange of positions between two units will be adhered to regardless of what fancy convoy maneuver may be attempted to effect the exchange.
12. The decisions of the Gamesmaster and his assistant are final.

In the Slow games, the order will be the same with an extra issue in between each action. In the Fast games, all retreats must be included with the moves and build orders must be included with the Fall moves. In Blitzkrieg, well, good luck!
