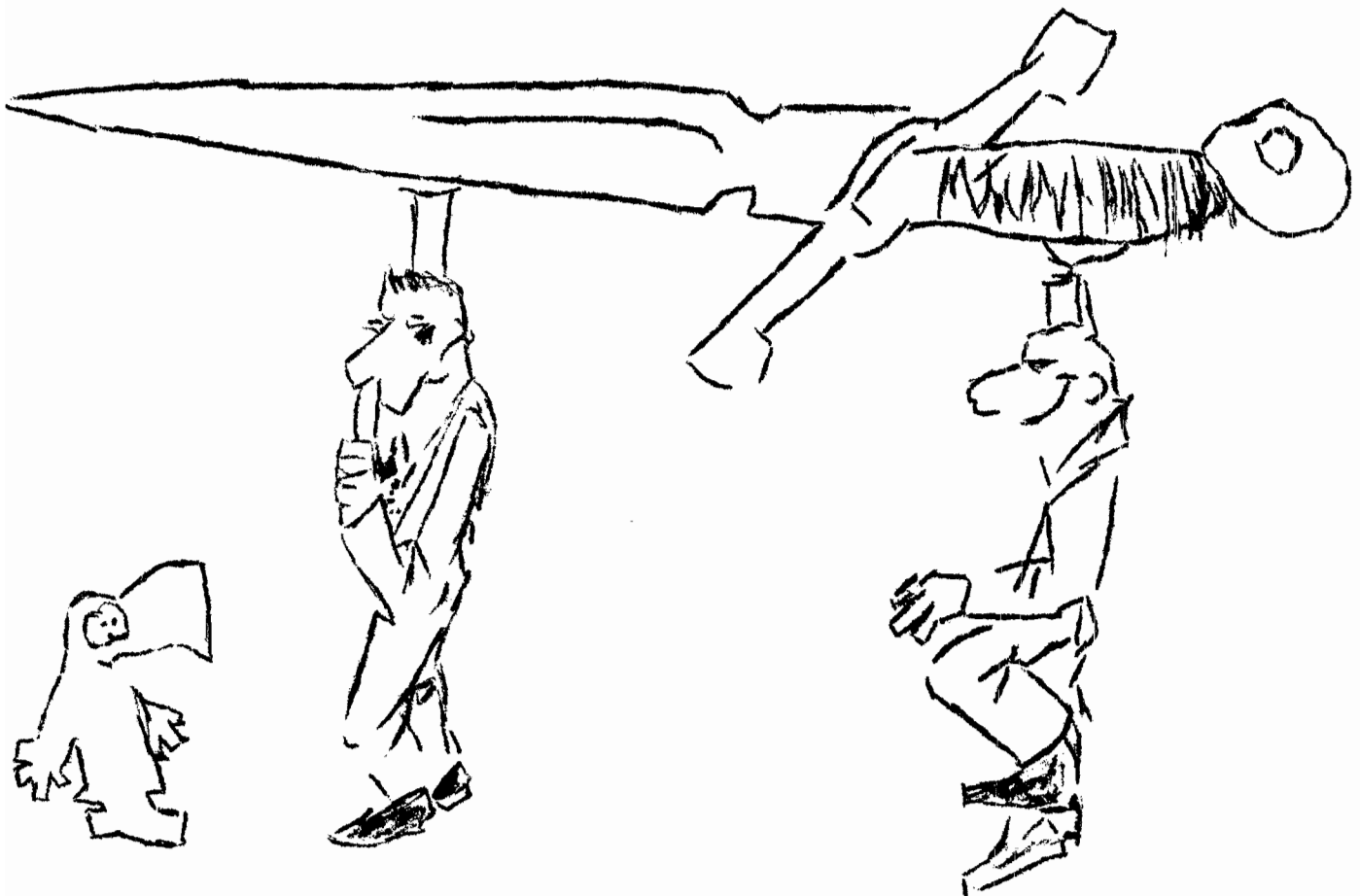

(Constantinople) In another rare personal appearance before the Senate, the Dictator Cincinnatus announced with regret that the British Fleet in the North Sea had refused to accept orders from the Stuart King of England, and was sunk by the Roman navy. He then requested that the Senate work out details for the occupation of Edinburgh and annexation of Scotland to the Stuart Crown.

An investigation conducted by the Cato faction turned up evidence of some fighting between Austrian and Roman units in the North. The Northern forces were ordered strengthened in response to the latest outburst from the Austrian Emperor. The Cato faction, after deliberation, withdrew their motion for a Declaration of War against Austria-Hungary but refused to support the Government's Senatus Consultum of praise and congratulation on the anniversary of the Austrian Emperor's birth. As he left the Senate House, the Dictator was heard to mutter that hard fighting was the best thing that ever happened to the Cato faction, and it has been rumoured that he intends to send their Legions to the Belgian front.

King Victor Emmanuel also sent his personal assurances to the Russian Emperor, noting that Roman occupation of the North Sea was regrettably required by the German victory in Belgium. It was noted that units of the Roman Marines were making ready for landings along the German coast, and it is believed that before the year is out Roman units will hold either Denmark or Holland.

(Budapesth) Baron Münchhausen, reportedly here on the track of the mysterious Hungarian Drithe, will hold a press conference at the entrance to the Budapesth

Cetecombs this afternoon at 4:00. The Drithe, reportedly a cabal of nine apathetic, sympathetic old men on roller skates with a distinct propensity for procrastination and sloth, is rumoured to be engaged in a struggle with the Imperial Court, lead by Emperor Franz-Joseph and Baron Munchhausen for control of the Empire and Protectorate of Europe . . .

(Occupied Rumania) Citizens here are witnessing the strange drama of clandestine warfare as the secret police and guerilla forces of the Austrian Empire seek to eliminate similar groups of agents loyal to the declining Ottoman Empire.

Observers report that at least two groups of Austrian agents appear often, whose goals seem to coincide only in the matter of eliminating Turks . . .

(Vienna) Emperor Franz-Joseph, in a speech on the occasion of the Imperial review of the new Seventh Imperial Army, pronounced, "Military forces in the South already suffice to insure ultimate victory of Right and Justice. Our new task is to insure the integrity of the remainder of our Protectorate. Skirmishing between our forces and German Uhlans has taken place in Tyrolia." At this revelation, the crowd recoiled in shock and confusion. Silence prevailed as the Emperor continued, "The future is uncertain. We are all aware of the Threatening undercurrents of internal strife which manifest themselves daily, from Vienna and Budapesth. through our India Empire, to the Pacific Marche territory of Samoa, all of elements stand united against those who would dispute the control of the Imperial territories!"

While seated at the conference table the other day, discussing the format and policies of the new Diplomacy newspaper wherein I'll be the Assistant Gamesmaster - (There will be a maximum of geographic distribution, only one person per state or province in each game, a minimum of three Eastern players per game, and slower games for English or European players. Hopefully, there will be the possibility of withdrawing to save the game fee as in W'n W, with the added feature of immediate replacement players by holding the game for the replacement. Suggested game fees are \$4 for one game plus 50¢ for each addtl. Subs, 10 for \$1 Postcards will be used to streamline the game but everything will be published.), the question was asked about what rules would be used for the conduct of the games. 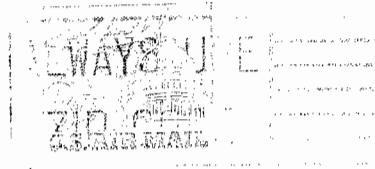
Game fees: \$6.00 for the first game and 50¢ for each additional game paid for at the same time.
