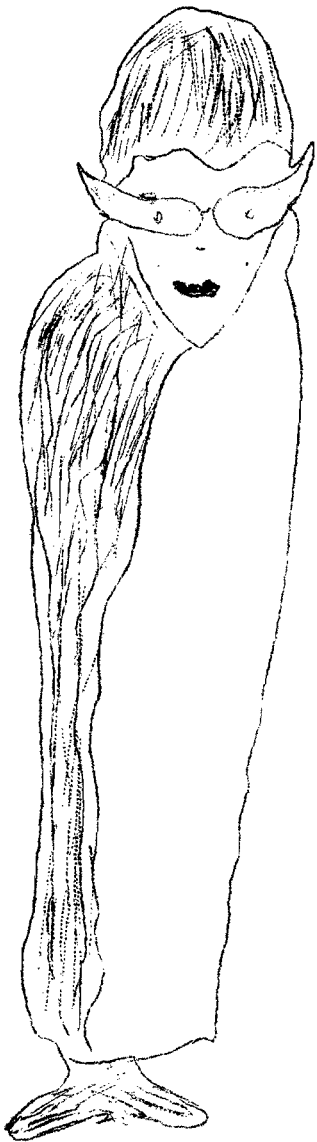

CLAUDIANA (Ides of January MCCLXI AD) Battle-scarred veterans of the Roman Imperial Legions ran in terror as an animated corpse arose from the sepulchral vaults of the former Austrian Emperors. Before its occupation by the Neo-Roman Empire, this city had been known as "Wien or "Vienna". Since the treachery of its last Emperor, Philipp I of the Biebermann dynasty, it was seized and held for the Roman Emperor, Senate, and People. All had thought the old Austrian Empire dead.

Terrified soldiers agree that the ghostly figure walked out of the tombs and wailed that it had returned to hunt the Romans who had overthrown Austria-Hungary. It then buckled on a sword and vowed its determination to aid the Gallic attempt to conquer the Roman Empire and its Polish allies. We have two new proposed rules:

- A. An army, attempting to move, and stood off may be Supported in its starting point.
- B. An army or fleet may Support any unoccupied land province (to which it could otherwise attempt to move to) for its current ownership without the existence of a unit to be supported. Thus, a unit could hold its ground and defend an adjacent province without attempting to move there.
