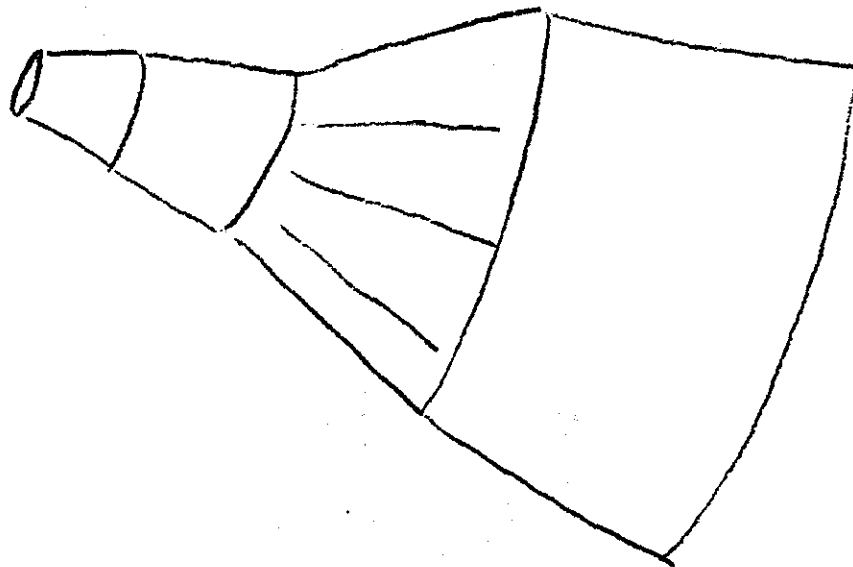

(Rome) His Majesty, Victor Emmanuel, in consultation with the Senate, declared the entire Scandinavian peninsula under the protection of the Roman Empire. "Although these nations have not previously been part of the Roman Domains," His Majesty stated, "We see no way to secure Peace and Order in Europe except through occupation of these territories. The Russians have repeatedly attempted to take portions of our Austrian ally's territory. The last Autumn, they (niybt) ab akk iyt desecrate all (sounds just like the niybt) they mounted an all out offensive on all quarters of the Austrian Empire. It is clear that war perpetual will prevail throughout Europe if the Roman Empire does not act. We have, accordingly, ordered the appropriate action. Once Scandinavia is secured, peace perpetual will reign throughout Europe under the Pax Romana."

Wild Applause greeted the announcement, and the Papal Blessing was given to the troops of His Most Christian, Most Catholic, Majesty, Victor Emmanuel, King of Italy, Emperor of the Roman Domains, Protector of Scotch-land, King of England, Wales, Ireland, Berwick on Tweed, King of Scandinavia, Protector of the Tyrol, Margrave of Brandenburg, count Palatine, and etc.

Italian troops have gained a decisive position in the struggle for domination of Europe, as bands played in the Forum and Cincinattus made what was announced to be his last public appearance.

The Dictator, accompanied by his Majesty Victor Emmanuel and the entire Senate, praised our Austrian Allies and told the cheering throngs that without that Austrian aid, the Victory would have been impossible. Cato was also praised, and it was discovered for the first time that he never really believed that the Austrians would dishonor the alliance. His faction in the Senate had been instructed by His Majesty and the Dictator to continue to denounce the Austrians while the Roman Office

quietly assured them that the Alliance was still firm.

This came as a shock to many members of the Cato faction, as they were mostly Tyroleans. The Tyrol, now held by Italy is still a portion of the Austrian Empire and will be ceded to Austria when hostilities cease. The Tyrolian Alpiner Divisions will hold their homeland, but much of the area is to revert to Austrian rule.

Members of the Cato Faction muttered darkly, but this was the only sign of unhappiness in the wildly cheering throng.

The Imperial War Office, meanwhile, worked on as usual, consolidating the gains made and preparing detailed plans for assuring that Italy would retain the dominant position that they have held for so long.

When asked by reporters, to which units he would attribute the Victory, Il Dictator praised all of the Armies and Fleets, but said that the English Fleet which held the North Sea for so long whiled hopelessly out numbered and the Italiana 1st Fleet of the Norwegian seas were chiefly responsible, although neither fought many battles. "But mostly," he told the reporters, "the good faith of Supreme Chancellor of Austria in keeping our Agreements, not only to the letter, but also in spirit!, is largely responsible for our success. Let it be known that the Chancellor of Austria is as trustworthy as ever any head of state I have ever known!"

Dear Dan,

The basis of KRYPTO (which I describe as a nobler gas than XENO) is as follows:

The Gamesmaster locates certain neutral planets at the start of the game.

PLANET TYPES:

1. DUD good for nothing
2. FUEL suitable for fuel only
3. RAW MATERIALS
4. COLONIZABLE PLANETS restricted to:
 - a. Oxygen Earthlike
 - b. Chlorine Sauerian
 - c. Sulfur Amphibian
 - d. Hydrogen Frigid High gravity

Players must specify which atmosphere they breathe at the beginning of the game.

(more on this later)

Meanwhile, we're starting a XENO game. It will go slow at first, until some players discover each other and wars break out. Game fee: \$2 (and a possible assessment every 3 years)

Also, there will be another Wild 'n Woolly gas game for 28 players starting this next winter.
