ON THE CARE AND BREEDING OF PIRATES

(Berlin, INS) Prince Bernhard von Bulow today granted an interview to explain the German position in the war crisis in Europe. Chancellor von Bulow announced that the scare was due to "French revanchist feelings with high governmental and military support." The German people will not see their place in the sun destroyed by French intrigues. We pledge ourselves to defend Alsace Lorraine and to come to the aid of the Low Countries against French aggression.

General Schlieffen announced the mobilization of the first dragoons under General Von Kluck in Berlin and the 2nd Dragoons under Crown Prince Rupert in Munich. Admiral Scheer has ordered the fleet to sea for possible action.

LATE BULLETIN: The German Foreign Office has announced that Admiral Scheer has been ordered to seize Denmark for the duration. The move was justified as necessary to "Prevent a stab in the back while German arms were safeguarding the Fatherland on other fronts.

Text of the remarks of Chancellor Robert Ward upon assuming office:

My Fellow Germans:

This is a trying time for the German Empire. While sincerely desiring peace we have been forced to prepare for war. As the peace of Europe crashes down amongst us let us remember always; though the German people sincerely desire peace, we shall fight to the death against the transgressors who desire to didmember the German Empire, enslave the German people, and dishonour the German Government.

We shall march forth, firm in our convictions, true in our alliances, steadfast in our goals. To those who would cast us aside, to those who would threaten the German Hegemony over the Baltic, to those who would seek to destroy the very idea of Germany, we cry, "DEATH TO THE TYRANTS AND FOES OF THE IMPERIAL GERMAN REICH!"

(Berlin - John Roberts Exclusive) As the first guns have sounded over strife torn Europe, Germany has aquired a new Chancellor. While serving in the Cabinet the past two years as Foreign Minister, he has impressed Europe in his desperate efforts to acheive peace. This, to some, seems to disqualify him as a war-time Chancellor.

Yet, unlike ex-Chancellor von Bulow, he has always advocated strength as well as talk. His appointment was dictated by the German Army who seem to see in him a man who can gain the fruits of their victories, or possibly salvage the cost of their losses.

While in office only a few hours, he has already ordered all available troops to the Ruhr and to Holland and issued mobilization orders for two more army divisions. He is a firm advocate of Navy power and has instituted a crash building program that will not bear fruit for a few years.

In Chancellor Ward, the German people have gained a man who can be Resolute in trial and Determined in crisis. It remains to be seen whether he is magnanimous in victory or courageous in defeat.

(Copenhagen) The Danish people have accepted with unrestrained joy the presence of the German Fleet in the harbor of Copenhagen. With war incovetible the Danes feel safer with German forces protecting them and are encouraged by the prompt honouring of treaty obligations.

King Christain IX has dismissed the government of Premier Carlsburg and is personally handling the problems of foriegn relations growing out of the alliance. The King will probably be given hbnorary command of a German Division when war finally comes.

(Warszawa PAP) A naval battle near the southern entrance to the Strait of Kerch early this morning ended with the capture of a Black Sea pirate vessel and the survivors of its crew.

Government investigators reported that two pirate vessels attacked a moored destroyer and several unarmed fishing boats shortly before dawn today, killing at least ten persons. However, the Cruiser Koszalin, patrolling nearby, quickly intervened, and in a running battle inflicting heavy damage on both attacking ships, finally running one aground near the village of Tamanskaya. The grounded ship and nine of its crewmen were quickly captured. The other pirate ship escaped.

Shortly after the battle, it was revealed that the pirate ship was "fully equipped by a hostile European power." The crew reportedly consisted mainly of Bulgarians and Rumanians, who were not, however, sailing for their own governments.

It is now known that Rumania has withdrawn its ambassador from Poland and without explanation. Bulgaria had no ambassador in Warszawa. Polish Prime Minister Sawiczewski quickly called an emergency meeting of the Council of Ministers for this evening to act upon the situation.

LATE RELEASE: (Warszawa PAP) Foreign Minister Sawiczewski of the Kingdom of Poland announced that under terms of a new treaty signed tonight in Bucharest, the two signatory nations will co-operate to bid the Balkan coast of its notorious pirate fleets - an endeavour in which the Republic of Turkey has already pledged her participation. No details of the treaty or the proposed actions thereunder were given but the Foreign Minister did indicate that unlimited access for military forces were included in the provisions.

Immediately following General Sawiczewski's announcement, Minister of War and Military Affairs Admiral Dr. Ivan Ivanovich Lobachevsky-Smelch issued a statement "regretfully cancelling the proposed deactivation of the Polish Second Army." It was also learned that the Second Army Command, under General Witold Yusso, has been ordered transferred as soon as possible to Sevastopol.

(Ankara UPI) Perhaps the most astounding event in the history of this part of the world has taken place in the last few weeks. The centuries old Ottoman Empire has become a republic.

A revolutionary group known as the "Secret Society for Union and Progress", closely aligned with the Young Turk--Young Ottoman movement seized power nearly three weeks ago. The rebels were aided by the Third Imperial Army (formerly the Famed Macedonian Army in the Balkan Wars) under Mustafa Kemal Pasha.

After capturing Constantinople and imprisoning Abd al Amid, the army moved into central Turkey, taking Ankara. Ankara was made the Capital. This is the first time in its 2600 year history that Constantinople has not been the capital of the state that it is in.

After a pause of about three days, Mustafa Kemal embarked upon an amazingly successful lightning campaign in Armenia, Syria, and South Turkey. Only in Armenia were they greeted with anything but wild applause and complete acceptance from the peasants. The Turkish fleet milled around indecisively for a few days before going over to the rebels. Many able officers were killed trying to restore the Sultan.

Major (now General) Niasi defeated a large body of loyalist troops near Trapzon on the Black Sea, ending the last organized resistance to the new Regime.

In Ankara, Talaat Bey was selected President of the first meeting of the Turkish Parliament. He immediately named Rahmi Bey, a fabulously rich nobleman, Minister of the Economy. Talaat Bey's the former head of the Secret Society for Union and Progress. Rahmi Bey's fortune largely supported that organization. Mustafa Kemal Pasha was appointed Minister of War causing some anticipation in certain Balkan Capitals. One of President Talaat's first acts was to lift the news blackout that has isolated Turkey for the past few weeks.

A SPEECH BY PRESIDENT TALAAT BEY

Greetings, Nations of Europe and the World!

The new Turkey's foremost desire is peace. Our history is long and bloodstained. I believe that it is my destiny to cleanse Turkey of the gore of the ages and make her a model of tranquillity and democracy. Any dispute between nations that is brought to me shall be settled fairly and justly. The peacemaker is more glorious than the conqueror.

Secondly, I urge the Nations of the World to follow the Sterling example of the Kingdom of Poland and Muscovy and recognize my new Regime as quickly as possible.

NOTE: Unsuccessful moves (if any) will be in lower case letters instead of capital letters. Support, when cut, will be shown as holding. (This means that Support for an unsuccessful move when it is not cut, will be in lower case letters.)

GAME SPEEDS

Blitzkrieg	Games of the Devils	One game year per issue each 9 days. This means that you must send your Spring and Fall moves in together, complete with retreats and build orders.
Fast Games	Games of the Wolves	One game year each two issues. Retreats must be included with moves and build orders must be included with Fall moves.
Regular speed	Games of the Tigers	One game year each five issues. Spring move, Spring retreats, Fall move, Fall retreats, and Fall build orders each in its own separate issue.
Slow games	Games of the Dragons	One game year each ten issues. Every other issue will contain no action. Ideal for busy people and people in delayed post office areas.

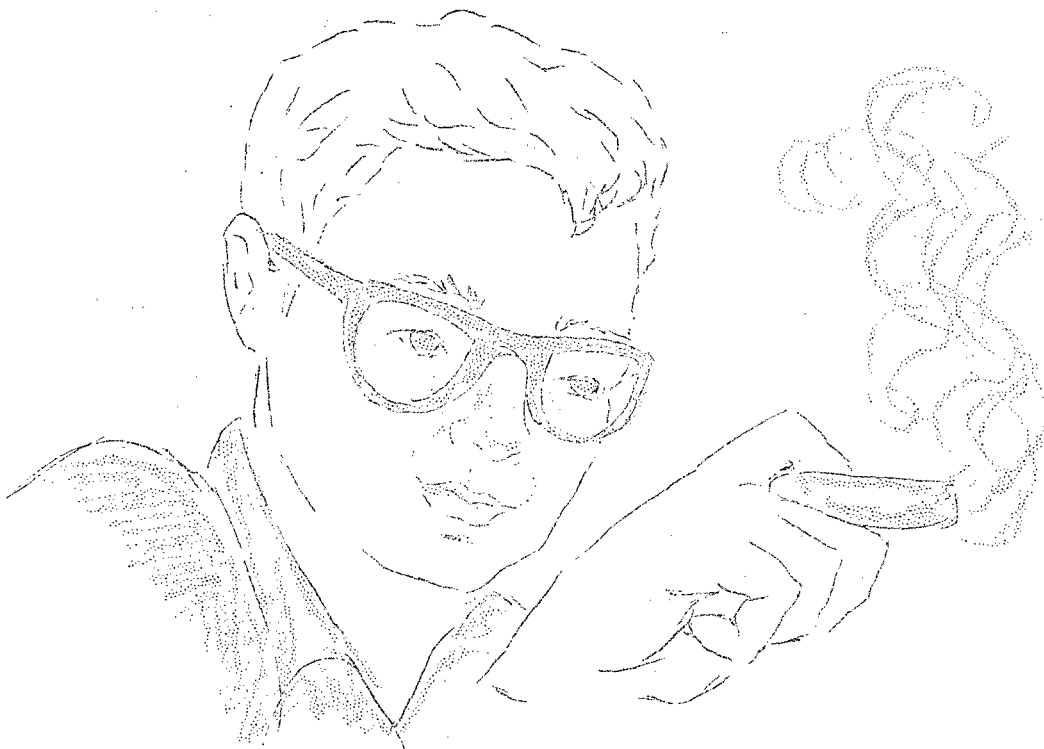

Your units will hold for the rest of the game. When you pay \$5.00 on or before the Spring 1902 move; the remainder of the payments will be waived.

RULES TO BE FOLLOWED BY THE GAMESMASTER

RULE #6 is SUSPENDED UNTILL FURTHER NOTICE

RULE #13. A convoy move does not cut support against the fleet in the body of water through which the army is convoyed last. When one of the fleets in the convoy-chain is dislodged, the attempted convoy does not cut any support at all.

To illustrate this rule:

FRANCE Fleet Tyrhennian Sea Convoys Italian Army Tunis to Naples.

The above is from an actual game played by members of the Los Angeles Science Fiction And Fantasy Society two years ago. The gamesmaster incorrectly ruled that the attack on Naples was from Tunis instead of the Tyrhennian and as such cut the Support for the Turkish Fleet. The convoy was ruled successfull. The Diplomacy Rulebook uses the word "direction" which means that the Support was good and the Fleet should have been dislodged.

RULE 14. When two or more units that are dislodged are given orders to retreat to the same place; they will both or all, be removed from the play.

This is unlikely to ever occur in any game but if it does, it will serve to encourage home-defense and also allow some of the heavily besieged units to escape to where they might be more usefull.

Graustark will soon publish a directory of names and addresses of people interested in Diplomacy and also a revised set of Graustark's Rules for Postal Diplomacy (much different from mine). Rules to be followed by the Gamesmaster

A free game will be awarded to the player against whom an error is made by the gamesmaster either in the application of the Diplomacy rules or in the application of precedents.

1. All of the original rules as published by Games Research, Inc. will be adhered to. (except for the choosing of countries by lot.)
2. A precedent set in a game will be followed throughout that game.
3. No conditional move will be accepted.
4. No joint moves will be accepted. (This means that moves from any two players if mailed together should be sealed in separate envelopes.)
5. Any unit attempting to move may be supported only to where it is going. If stood off it cannot be supported in the province it is in.
6. A unit attacked with more force than it has supporting it must retreat even though the attacking force is stood off by another attacking force. (This leaves the disputed area unoccupied.)
7. When a unit is successfully attacked from a given province that it is attempting to move to it still stands off any equally supported or less supported unit attempting to follow into that given province.
8. No moves, retreats, or building of units will be done for any player by the Gamesmaster and no retreats will be made automatically or conditionally. Even though there is no choice involved any unit which is dislodged and not given a retreat order will be removed from the play.
9. Deadlines will not be postponed for any reason with the one exception of the extra five days over Christmas. Please note that the deadlines published are postmark deadlines and not receipt deadlines. Local players must hand in their moves on the deadline date or mail them. Moves sent in by night letter must be dated for the deadline date or sooner.
10. When someone resigns from a game, his units are held for the duration of the game. If a player wishes to replace another player, he must first receive permission from the Gamesmaster and possibly pay a small fee, and then all of the other players still in the game must agree to the replacement before any moves will be accepted from him.
11. The rule against the exchange of positions between two units will be adhered to regardless of what fancy convey maneuver may be attempted to effect the exchange.
12. The decisions of the Gamesmaster and his assistant are final.

In the games at regular speed, one issue will be published for the Spring move, the next issue will be the Spring retreats, the next issue will be the Fall move, the next issue will be the Fall retreats, the next issue will be the "Winter" move for build orders, and the next issue will be the Spring move of the following year. In the slow games, the order will be the same with an extra issue in between each action. In the fast games, all retreats must be included with the moves and build orders must be included with the Fall moves. In Blitzkrieg, well, good luck!
