Hal Naus, of ADAG, is investigating taking over the rest of Brannan's games. I am not, as you can see, using either of Dan's 'zine names, and hope Hal will not use them either. This way, they will be available if Dan suddenly reappears (which he just may do). Copies of WNW will be sent to players, to Jeff Key, to Don Miller, to anyone who has something to trade for it, and to subscribers. Subscriptions are \$1/10. Games will be completed under EREHWON House-Rules (enclosed if you haven't been sent a copy already), with one exception: IF any player has been basing his strategy on a rule of Dan's which is different from mine, and if this rule is essential to his strat-

egy, I will use Dan's rule rather than mine.

1966C TURKS ADVISED: KHOW THYSELF...

Fall 1913: I have moves from everybody. The only problem is, John Koning sent me moves for England in 1966Z. Sigh... Anyway, John has until Thursday, 30 April 1970, to send Fall 1913 moves for Turkey. To recap, positions as of Spring 1913 were:

ENGLAND (McCallum): F Lon, F Nth, F Bal, A Lva, A Mos, A Ukr, A War, A Boh, A

Vie; Owns: Edi, Lpl, Lon, Den, Nwy, Swe, StP, Mos, War (9).

FRANCE (Wells): F Lyo, F Tun, F Alb, F Gre, A Pic, A Par, A Gas, A Pie, A Rom, A Bur; Owns: Bre, Mar, Par, Bel, Spa, Por, Nap, Rom, Ven, Tun (10).

GERMANY (Naus): A Hol, A Bol, A Ruh, A Tyr, A Ven, A Tri; Owns: Ber, Kie,

Mun, Hol, Tri, Vie (6).

TURKEY (Koning): F Bla, F Con, F Eas, F Aeg, F Ion, A Bul, A Rum, A Bud, A Sev;

Owns: Ank, Con, Smy, Sev, Rum, Bud, Ser, Bul, Gre (9).

Spring 1913 noves were wprinted in WILD 'N' WOOLY #142. If any player wishes to change the moves now on file, he has until the deadline above to do so.

Summer 1908: The last (Spring 1908) moves for 1966BO were printed in WILD "N" WOOLY #141. They are repeated below for the benefit of the players, along with the supply center list for Fall 1907. Of the two retreats, the French retreat is predetermined (only one choice) and the Turkish player has left the game (his unit is therefore /a/). In the latter case, the decision is academic anyway, since there one two places to which F Sny could have retreated, and no retreat order will (ob-

wiously) be submitted. The Spring 1908 moves (repeat):

FRANCE (Peery): A Ruh H /d//Bur/, F Spa(so) H, F Tyr H, A Gas H, A Pic H.
Cwas: Par, Har, Por, Spa, Tun (5).

GERMANY (civ.dis.): A Muh /h/. Owns: Mun (1).

ITALY (civ.dis.): A Rom /h/, F Nap /h/. Owns: Rap, Rom (2).

TURKEY (civ.dis.): A Arm /h/, F Smy /h/ /a/. Owns: Ank, Smy (2).

FALL 1908 MOVES are due Tuesday, 5 May 1970.

Replacement players will be used. Conrad vonMetake (who earlier agreed to sub for 1966C) will be asked to stand by for England. I will have a player at UCSD stand by for France. If you wish to negotiate with him (I don't know who it will be, yet), write: France 1966BO, c/o 5058 Hawley Blvd., SanDiego CA 92116. I will pass on anything you send. Any player who misses Fell moves will have them made by his standby. If he also misses Winter adjustments, his stand-by will replace him.

BOTH GAMES

Deadlines: These will be set 2 weeks (14 days) from the date I expect to mail the issue. For instance, although this issue is dated 22 April, I expect to mail it on the morning of the 21st. The deadline for 1966BO was accordingly set for 5 May.

Press Releases: Of course, within reason; so long as I can fit them in a standard two-page format.

Deadlines (again?) are receipt, not postmark. Receipt means by 3:00pm on the ley specified. Telephone moves are not accepted on the day of the deadline; on days before, after 7:00pm PST (or PDT when we switch over) and before 10:00 pm PST ONLY. I will refuse Special Delivery moves which are delivered before I'm ready to get up in the morning.

Why am I doing all this? None of you is a stranger to how I operate.
