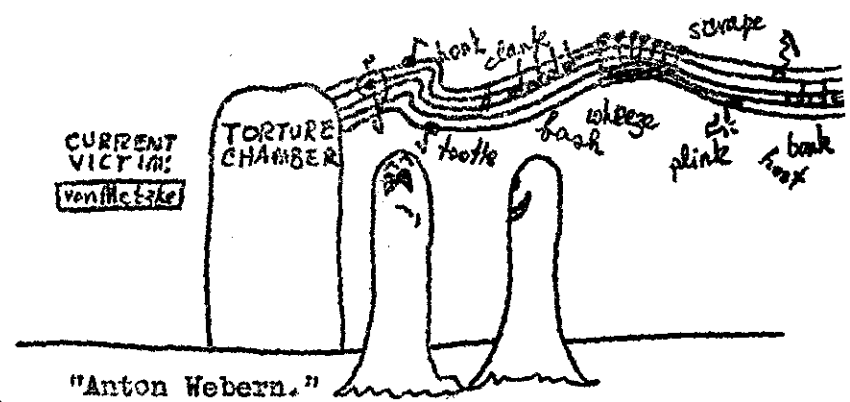


Wile 'n' Worry #13

1966C -- NO-MOVE

Fall 1916: John McCallum writes: "In my opinion 1966C is likely to continue to be No-Move for some time. Note that this time there were exactly three moves that changed anything.... Everything else was a stalemate and, I assume, was foreseen to be a stalemate by those who made /the moves/. In view of this do you think it would be possible for players, with their Spring moves, to submit Fall moves also? Such would have to be conditional upon the Spring moves of other players.... At best, I suppose, we will only save a move or two, but with the game within two months of being 5 years old even that would be something."

GM replies: I would rather not do this. In my opinion, a player should be able to see one set of moves before making the next. However, what do the rest of you think? I'll abide by whatever the majority wants. One thing to think about: If a game is so stalemated that every player can write all or most of his Fall moves without seeing the previous Spring, perhaps we have a 4-way draw on our hands.

ENGLAND (McCallum): A Lva H, F Den-Wth, F Eng-Mid, A Yor H, A War H, F Lon-Eng, A Mos S A Sev, A Rum MS A Bud, A Gal & A Sev S A Rum, A Ukr /h/.

FRANCE (Wells): A Gas-Bur S by A Mar, A Pic, & A Par, F Tri H S by F Alb & F Atr, F Ion-Tyr, A Ven-Tyr S by A Pic.

GERMANY (Naus): A Bur H S by A Ruh, A Bel, & A Mun, A Vie MS A Tyr.

TURKEY (Koning): A Con-Sev C by F Bla and S by A Arm, A Ser S FRENCH F Tri, F Aeg H, A Bul S A Ser.

SPRING 1917 MOVES are due Monday, 14 December 1970. There was no change in the supply center listing for 1915 (see WNW #10); and consequently no builds.

1966Z -- RUSSIA NEARS VANISHING POINT

Fall 1912:

ENGLAND (Koning): F Iri-Wal, A Nwy-Bol C by F Nth, F Wrg-Nat, F Lon-Wal, A Bud S RUSSIAN A Vie, A Pru S F Ber, A Moc H, F Den-Kie S by F Ber. Owns: Edi, Lpl, Lon, Den, Nwy, Sve, War, StP, Bud, Ber, Mos (11). Build 1.

FRANCE (Kuch): A Kio H S by A Hol, A Mun-Sil, A Mar-Bur, F Wes-Mid, F Lvo-Wes, F Eng-Bel, F Mid-Eng S by F Bre & A Pic (apt. imp). Owns: Bre, Mar, Par, Kie, Spa, Tun, Bel, Por, Hol, Mun (10). No change.

RUSSIA (Naus): F Rum H S by A Ukr & A Sev, A Vie S ENGLISH A Bud /d//Boh, Gal, Owns: Hpp, Sev, Rum, Vfb (2). Remove 2.

TURKEY (vonMetake): A Smy-Arm, A Ser-Bud, A Bul-Rum S by F Bla, F Aeg-Con, F Adr S A Tri, F Ion-Aog, F Nap-Apu, A Tyr-Vic S by A Tri. Ows: Ank, Con, Smy, Nap, Rom, Tri, Bul, Gre, Ven, Ser, Vic (11). Build 1.

SPRING 1913 MOVES are due Monday, 14 December 1970. I will have the Russian retreat and removals, and the Turkish build, in the next day or two and will mail them out via postcard. If the English build makes any difference, players may make their moves conditional upon what it is.
