1966Z -- SULTAN WINS!!

Winter 1914: France concedes to Turkey. England's failure to submit moves amounts to concession. The moves, then: ENGLAND (Koning): NMR. A War (R)-ob. GM E A Pru. FRANCE (Kuch): No change. TURKEY (vonMetzke): B A Ank, A Con, A Smy and wins by concession. If the English player protests this by the 6 April deadline, we will recontinue (the protest must be accompanied by S15 moves).
