ment of postal Diplomacy players. Subscriptions are 10/\$1. The game fee is \$4 (\$3 for NFFFGB, LFW, or DA members).

NEW HOUSE-RULES (15 June 1971) have been published. They are about the same as the old ones. You should get a copy with this issue. If you have not received a copy by the time #23 arrives, please notify me. There

is one change to those rules:

HOUSE-RULE 8 (old HR 7) is hereby cancelled. Collect long-distance calls are too expensive for most players and they are inefficient. I have a new, better system. This is the Advance Payment Call. Any player who wishes to be called when he misses a move must deposit with the GM the sum of \$1 (this sum is standard per player, regardless of how many games he is in). The GM can then call the player by direct dial (which is very much cheaper) after 5pm Pacific Time. The actual cost of the call is taken out of the \$1 and the player must replenish the deposit. If the call costs over \$1, the player must make up the difference and will be removed from his game(s) if he does not do so within 2 months. The placement of such a call counts as a missed move under HR 9 (old 8). I will attempt to call 3 times on the deadline night (or the first available night thereafter), at hourly intervals. If the player is not at home when I call, I will set a deadline for a return call. If the call is not returned, there will be no further attempt to obtain moves. In the event a person-to-person call is required: there is no price difference and such calls will be made collect. All players desiring calls are requested to confirm their numbers, state best time to call, and specify "station" (with deposit) or "person". The deposit will be refunded at the end of the last game the player is in inany of my izines, or if he resigns, or upon his elimination from his last game with me, or upon his request.

A SECOND WINNERS! GAME will open when 1966C is over, or perhaps sooner. The game fee is the same. For persons already in 1971BF, the fee is \$2. For others, as given above. If you want in the game, let me know and I

will reserve a slot for you, Please do not send a game fee.
