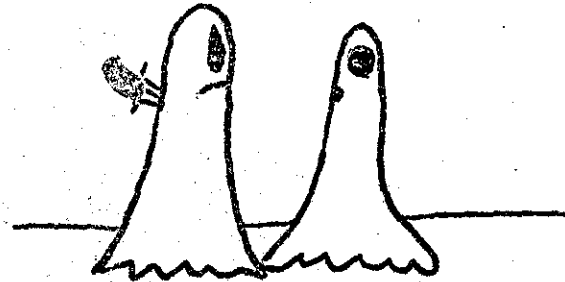

GASCHURN (IPI)(14 April 1901): Graf G. von Warren today ordered the Imperial First Army into the Tirol to counter an expected Italian incursion into the county. VonWarren, the Imperial Minister of War, stated that he could conceive of no circumstances under which the Emperor would sanction such filibustering expeditions through Austrian territory.

VIENNA (IPI)(18 April 1901): Imperial Minister of War vonWarren officially served a declaration of war on the Russian ambassador and declared him persona non grata as a result of the Tsar's intervention in Austro-Hungarian affairs through sending troops into Galicia. Minister vonWarren followed this action with a public statement calling upon the nations of Europe to join with Austria in "subjecting the Tsar to the drubbing he so rightly deserves".
