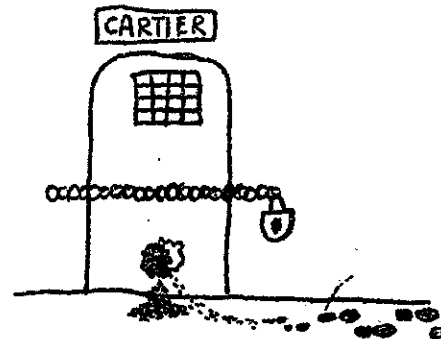

You can get everything I publish (everything with a PanPub number) for one low price. Here's how. All 'zines will be set aside in a manila envelope. ### 1966C -- GERMAN MARINES MASSACRED IN LISBON; ENGLAND BLOATS SOME MORE

Fall 1922 -- The English player noted, and the Turkish player apprised, that the English order "F Aeg-Ion" should have read "F Gre-Ion".

**ENGLAND (McCallum):** F Nat, F Nch, F Ion, A Alb, A Ser H; A Yor H (they also serve who only stand and wait), A Bud H S by A Rum, A Mos-Sev, A Sev-Arm, A Syr-Smy S by F Eas, F Aeg-Con S by A Bul. Owns: Edi, Lpl, Lon, Nwy, Swe, StP, Mos, War, Bud, Sev, Rum, Ser, Bul, Gre, Con, Smy (16). Build 2.

**FRANCE (Wells):** A Bur (R)-Par. A Tyr-Vie S by A Tri, A Par-Bur S by A Pic (A Pic /d//Bre, ob/), A Ven-Pie, F Nap-Tyr, F Tyr-Lyo, F Mid-Por S by A Spa. Owns: Bre, Mar, Par, Spa, Rom, Ven, Tun, Tri, Nap, Por (10). Build 1 (build 2 if A Pic does not retreat).

**GERMANY (Naus):** F Por-Spa(sc) /a/, A Vie MS A Boh, A Bur-Pic S A Bel, A Ruh-Bur S by A Mun, A Kie S A Min. Owns: Ber, Kie, Mun, Hol, Vie, Bel, Den, Pöt (7). No change (1 /a/).

TURKEY (vonMetzke): F Ank-Ela, A Con H /a/, A Arm-Ank. Owns: Ank, ~~Opp~~, ~~Opp~~ (1). Remove 1 (1. /a/).

WINTER 1922 ADJUSTMENTS are due immediately. I have England's builds, can get Turkey's removal any time I want, and request the French build (in Marseilles, obviously) as quickly as possible. These will all be sent out by postcard.

SPRING 1923 ORDERS are due on Thursday, 7 October 1971.

1971EF -- EVERYBODY BUILDS A FLEET (SOME ARMIES APPEAR, ALSO)

Winter 1901: The Russian order A Gal-Rum in FO1 obviously failed. Gary Jones has missed his deadline for this game, and General Orders were used. I have no official stand-by players, but since Hal Naus has volunteered to be a replacement any time I needed him, he is requested to send stand-by Spring 1902 orders for Russia and will replace Gary if he misses again. AUSTRIA (Key): Build A Bud, F Tri.

ENGLAND (Keathley): Build F Lon.

FRANCE (Smythe): Build F Ere, F Mar.

GERMANY (Goldstein): Build A Ber, A Mun, F Kie.

ITALY (Eller): Build F Nap.

RUSSIA (Jones?)(by GO): Build F StP(nc), A Mos.

TURKEY (Thomson): Build F Smy.

SPRING 1902 ORDERS are due on Thursday, 7 October 1971.
