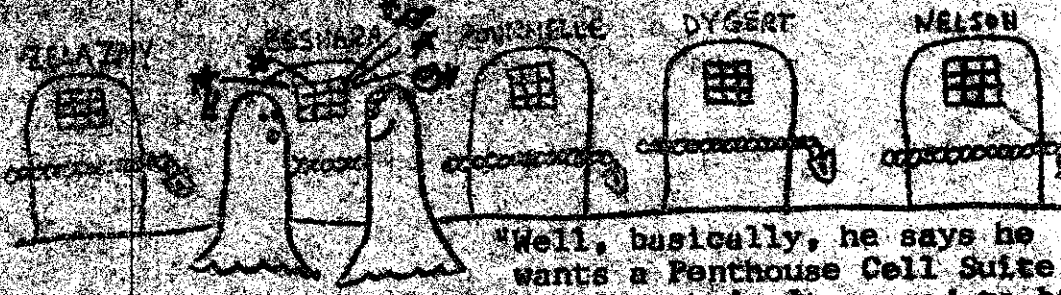

PALERMO, SICILY (Butler Press)(5 March 1901): Her Highness, the Princess Lucretia diBorgia, today announced that she had no designs on the Italian government. Clad in hip-boots and a leather toga, and flicking her whip over the backs of reporters as she talked, Her Highness asked, "What would make anyone think that I would want to dominate anything?" The Princess, now in exile, but at one time known to the world as Pope Joan II, is noted for having introduced many interesting new features into the celebration of the mass.
