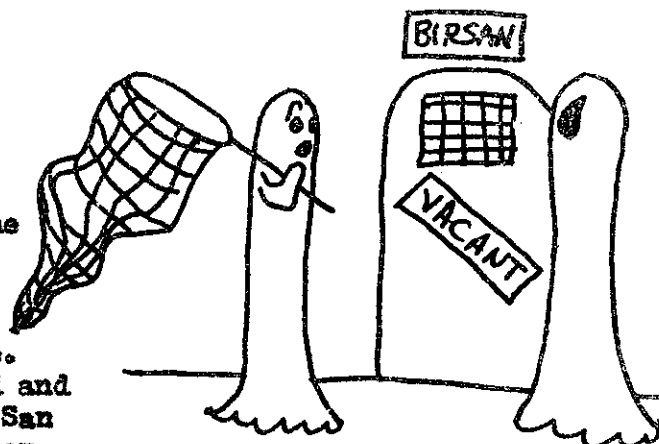


WILE 'N' WORRY

Winter 1910: Terry Kuch writes, "F Bar-StP(no), F Bot S F Bar-StP(no)." Was this a slip, or do you rule that F Bot can support a move into a space it cannot itself move to?" This ruling was made in accordance with the rule that a fleet may give support into StP "without regard for the separation of the coastline into two stretches". The dispute about "space" does not even enter. However, in addition, St.Petersburg is only one space, just as Livonia or the Gulf of Bothnia.
