I was just beginning to pride myself on how well the games were running when I ran afoul of the Postal Service. After moving last Fall, I never got around to putting my name on the apartment mail box. Procrastination would be one of my better virtues if I could ever get around to practicing it. Anyway, our route was given to a new postman who stopped delivering anything not addressed to a name on the box. This happened the day before the deadline printed in issue #11. In issue #12, two players allegedly NMR'd. They were Mark Duarte in 1982AF and Joe Lammers in 82CA. Well, they really didn't NMR. Their moves got returned as undeliverable. After several days, and many calls to the Postmaster, we got things straightened out. I sent letters explaining what had happened and self-addressed stamped envelopes to every player I didn't have recent moves for. At that time I didn't know that Mark and Joe had a problem.

Mark resubmitted his orders in the original unopened envelope (Thanks Larry McCloud for forwarding them on). I have decided to allow his orders, rework 82AF for the Spring 04, delay Fall 04 until the next issue, and am sending all 6 players first class stamps (five to send letters to each of the other 5 players, and one to submit moves to me).

Joe has a different problem. I didn't learn his orders were returned until he sent in his Fall '03 moves. Unlike Mark, Joe did not request that I allow his Spring '03 moves. I hope he will not be offended that I decided not to delay the game. Sorry, Joe, maybe this will bring some sympathy from the other players in 1982CA and help you in the long run.

I apologize to everyone for this. I know it has cost some of you extra postage. I have tried to compensate, with stamps, those who obviously went to great lengths to try to communicate with me - Mark Duarte, Dan Stafford and Larry McCloud.

Dan tried so hard to break through that he sent four letters to my current address (one addressed to "Occupant"), and one to my former address that was forwarded to me. Sorry, Dan.

Sorry, everyone. Please accept my apology and know that Mark Duarte and Joe Lammers did NOT NMR through their own actions. It was my fault.

Con-Rom: F ION-AEG? Not very nice.


Rom-Con: The last Aegean bounce was just for security.







Also, our sweeper passed out on the field from pushing herself too hard. And you guys think you're tough. How long has it been since you've pushed yourself past the anaerobic threshhold? I don't recommend it, it scared me to see her lying flat on her face. But I must admit to feeling a sense of pride she was willing to work that hard for the team.

Our sense of team has reached a new height. This is our third year. We only had a turnover of 3 players. We've changed our jerseys and look more like a soccer team than a walking advertisement for a local hairdresser. We've even got sweatsuits. Macho! We're playing together much better with wall passes, overlaps, and moving off the ball.

Our offense is suffering from a lack of finishing punch. We lost our top center forward and without practices haven't developed a replacement yet. But we will. Win or lose - it's one of the most exciting team experiences I've ever had and it keeps building. Maybe we'll win this Saturday if the weather holds.
