Italy-Germany and others: Save Cathy's skin! Collect it! Trade it with your friends!


Italy-Italy: Save Cupcake's stupid press releases! Collect them! Trade them with the friends you have left!

Switzerland to C.U.P.C.A.K.E.: I'm afraid that Austria is planning on delivering some tortes right to your front door!


