Foundation's Edge is a remarkable look at the decision-making process of characters of widely differing heritage and motivation. I found myself yelling for the choice I wanted at the climactic decision point; thankfully, the Good Doctor granted my wish. I found Friday to be enjoyable, if less significant than other Heinlein works. I don't find it sexist at all; Friday is intelligent and capable in a very rough business; her weakness is an understandable sensitivity regarding her origin as a parentless product of genetic engineering. Her sex-role attitudes seem reasonable enough for her. Heinlein understands a sometimes unpopular fact: men and women are different, mutually dependent, and strongly affected by their varying capabilities and weaknesses. And for all the problems caused by this bipolarity, vive la difference!

I'd like to recommend Harrison's <u>Stainless Steel Rat</u> books, Douglas Adams' <u>Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy trilogy</u>, anything by Larry Niven, and <u>Spider Robinson's Callahan's Crosstime Saloon stories</u>. Have I mentioned these before?

I read Haldeman's <u>Mindbridge</u> and <u>The Forever War</u> when I was younger; I enjoyed them. I can't find them in local bookstores, so I guess I'll have to hit the library.

Oh well, gotta run. Take it sleazy.

((Your Diplomatoid comments caused me to reflect that the process you went through is not unique to Diplomacy or you, but is a process that occurs when anyone interacts with anyone else over something of mutual interest.
