Five held on drug charges in post office investigation

A "sting" operation in which U.S. Postal Service undercover agents posed as post office employees led to the arrest of five suspects on drug charges, authorities said yesterday.

The suspects, all Postal Service employees, were arrested on separate felony charges of selling cocaine to undercover postal inspectors at the Marina del Rey Mail Processing Facility and the World Way Postal Center at Los Angeles International Airport.

Amounts the suspects allegedly tried to sell ranged from 10 grams of cocaine to less than half a gram.

Each of the suspects, including a 14 year Postal Service employee, was arraigned in U.S. District Court yesterday before U.S. Magistrate James J. Penne on one count of possession and one count of distributing cocaine. The arrests were made late Wednesday night and early yesterday morning.

The suspects were released on \$5,000 and \$10,000 bail. A preliminary hearing

is scheduled for July 5.

Postal Inspector Bill Watson said more than five suspects had originally been under investigation. But he would not comment on whether similar investigations were under way at other facilities or whether the investigation at the Marina and airport offices was closed.

He said the suspects apparently did not use the mail to obtain or ship drugs.

Arrested at the Marina facility were Los Angeles residents Mercedes Evans, 33, the 14-year employee; Harriet Anderson, 26, a clerk; and Mike Nelson, 28, a mail distributor.

Taken into custody at the airport office were Wendell Butler, 30, of Long Beach, an operator, and Elizabeth Tarvyd, 24, of Los Angeles, a distribution clerk.

Watson said, "To my knowledge, they (the suspects) were unrelated. There was

no kind of group activity.

He said the investigation had been initiated by the U.S. Postal Service after receiving information from "unnamed sources."

Watson said the investigation took months in order to arrest all the suspects.

"An arrest earlier would have jeopardized the arrest of others," Watson said.

Affidavits filed in court yesterday by each of the postal investigators revealed that each posed under a pseudonym and remained undercover.

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
