

England (Terry Tallman) The odds on having three players in a country and being able to work with each in turn approach the astronomical. So I have to credit luck as well as skill for pulling off the draw.

The first French player started 3 games in the space of two months. I happened to be in all three. And then he dropped all his games.

Larry McCloud was the second frog. For about a year it seemed like Larry

picked up every standby in the hobby. He and I were in 4 games together at one point. We got along well and it was with him that we swept east.

France would have bogged down if Italy would have joined the "Stop the E-F"

movement but he bought France the time to move into position in the Med after Germany fell.

Russia got bogged down in the south and was never in a position to stop the E-F although things got better for the eastern powers when Keller came in for Austria.

Ken Peel came on board and was willing to keep the momentum going for a two way.

I was a little dissappointed to see this end because I've never really fought a postal game to a final, dot-stomping conclusion.

However, I believe the draw was a foregone conclusion for the last two game years because neither France nor England were in position for a fatal stab; and were, in fact, disengaging units on their mutual border.

In short, England and France were allied from day one and despite 2 changes in the French regime marched on to victory. My thanks to all three.




