INTRODUCTION

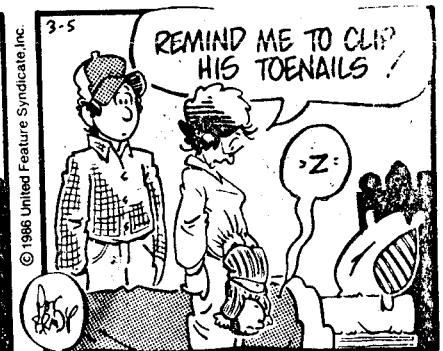
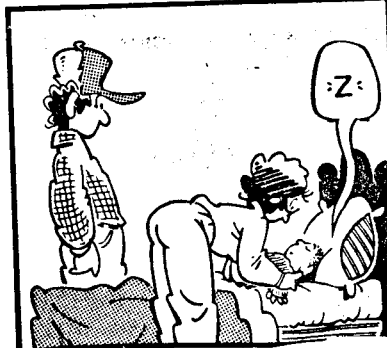
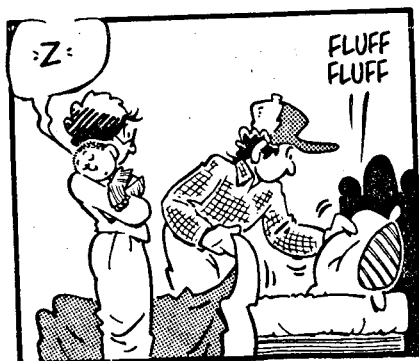
